BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section 1: Creating a new act called the "Pathway Act."

Section 2: Defining key terms for the Act.

Section 3: To be eligible for the program, a person must have been in foster care for at least 18 cumulative months, be at least 18 years of age, and have completed a financial literacy course. The Department of Finance Administration (DFA) shall transfer \$2,000 to eligible people upon request only once to be used only for housing, education, or workforce training.

Section 4: Creates the "Pathway Program Fund" to be administered by DFA.

Section 5: Provides that the Act does not create a property interest or guarantee to anyone.

Section 6: Exempts money from the Fund from state income taxation for individuals in New Mexico.

Section 7: Appropriates \$4 million from the early childhood education fund to the program, which does not revert and is recurring annually.

Section 8: Act to begin in January 2026.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill will not have a fiscal impact on the Office of Family Representation and Advocacy (OFRA). It will require some resources from DFA and the Children Youth and Families Department (CYFD).

Potentially, this program could exceed the appropriation if it includes all children who were in foster care at any time throughout their life for an 18-month period.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Supporting children who have aged out of foster care is extremely important. The

program would need to be easily accessible and navigable.

The bill is vague regarding implementation of the program and how CYFD and DFA should collaborate.

It is unclear why the payment would need to only be a one-time occurrence, as different expenses could come up at different times.
