**57TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 2025**

AN ACT

RELATING TO DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES; ENACTING THE DIGITAL AGE  
VERIFICATION ACT; REQUIRING AGE VERIFICATION; PROVIDING  
ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

**SECTION 1.** [NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE.--This act may be  
cited as the "Digital Age Verification Act".

**SECTION 2.** [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the  
Digital Age Verification Act:

A. "activate" means the process of associating the  
device with a user account;

B. "application store" means a publicly available  
software application that distributes the software applications  
of third-party platforms to a mobile device;

C. "covered manufacturer" means a manufacturer of a

1 device, an operating system for a device or an application  
2 store;

3 D. "department" means the state department of  
4 justice;

5 E. "device" means a device or a portion of a device  
6 that communicates across a network with computers or other  
7 devices to transmit, receive or store data and includes a  
8 desktop, laptop, cellular telephone, tablet or other device  
9 that communicates with or across a network, excluding those  
10 used by or under the direction of an educational entity; and

11 F. "digital signal" means a transmission using  
12 secure industry-standard transmission protocols or an end-to-  
13 end encrypted electronic transmission by or from a device and a  
14 covered manufacturer, an application store or any other party  
15 regulated under the Digital Age Verification Act.

16 SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] AGE VERIFICATION REQUIRED.--

17 A. At the time an individual activates a device, a  
18 covered manufacturer shall take commercially reasonable and  
19 technically feasible steps to:

20 (1) ask the user or the user's parent or  
21 guardian to provide the user's age during account setup;

22 (2) if a user or the user's parent or guardian  
23 does not opt out, enable a feature to provide applications with  
24 a digital signal indicating whether the user is under the age  
25 of thirteen, thirteen years of age to fifteen years of age,

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1 sixteen years of age to seventeen years of age or eighteen  
 2 years of age or older through a real-time application  
 3 programming interface; and

4 (3) provide features that the user's parent or  
 5 guardian can use to require parental or guardian consent prior  
 6 to allowing a user under sixteen years of age to download an  
 7 application from the application store.

8 B. For devices sold prior to January 1, 2026,  
 9 covered manufacturers shall take commercially reasonable and  
 10 technically feasible steps to ensure that the requirements of  
 11 Subsection A of this section are included in the device's  
 12 latest operating system and application store versions and  
 13 updates by default ninety days after the effective date of the  
 14 Digital Age Verification Act.

15 C. The department may promulgate rules in  
 16 accordance with the Digital Age Verification Act to implement  
 17 the provisions of that act.

18 **SECTION 4. [NEW MATERIAL] ENFORCEMENT.--**

19 A. A violation of the Digital Age Verification Act  
 20 is an unfair and deceptive trade practice actionable under the  
 21 Unfair Practices Act.

22 B. Prior to initiating any action to enforce the  
 23 Digital Age Verification Act, the department shall provide a  
 24 covered manufacturer thirty days' written notice identifying  
 25 the violation of the Digital Age Verification Act that the

1 department alleges has been or is being violated. If within  
2 the thirty-day period the covered manufacturer cures the  
3 noticed violation and provides the department an express  
4 written statement that the alleged violation has been cured and  
5 that no further violations shall occur, no action shall be  
6 initiated against the covered manufacturer for that alleged  
7 violation.

8 C. If a covered manufacturer continues to violate  
9 the Digital Age Verification Act following the cure period in  
10 Subsection B of this section or breaches an express written  
11 statement provided to the department under that subsection, the  
12 attorney general may initiate an action pursuant to the Unfair  
13 Practices Act.

14 SECTION 5. [NEW MATERIAL] INTERIM COMMITTEE STUDY.--The  
15 New Mexico legislative council shall require the interim  
16 legislative committees that study issues related to science and  
17 technology and economic and rural development to:

18 A. consult with the department to examine the most  
19 effective and feasible method to expand the protections of the  
20 Digital Age Verification Act to websites and online services;  
21 and

22 B. develop legislative proposals for the 2026  
23 legislative session to implement expanded protections based on  
24 the committees' findings.

25 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.--
