25	SECTION 1. Section 21-21G-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988,

6	units commencing with the fall term each year;
7	B. "award recipient" means a <u>New Mexico resident</u>
8	student awarded a graduate scholarship;
9	C. "department" means the higher education
10	department;
11	D. "eligible institution" means [ <del>any</del> ] <u>a</u> graduate-
12	degree-granting state university <u>in New Mexico</u> accredited by
13	the [ <del>north central association of colleges and secondary</del>
14	schools] higher learning commission;
15	E. "graduate [ <del>and professional</del> ] field" means [ <del>any</del> ]
16	<u>a</u> program of study intended to result in a master's or doctoral
17	degree, excluding [ <del>the degree in medicine</del> ] <u>a doctor of</u>

20	means women, minorities, persons with a visual impairment or
21	other physical disability and other groups [ <del>who</del> ] <u>that</u> have

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1	Chapter 111, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:
2	"21-21G-5. CONDITIONS FOR FIRST-YEAR ELIGIBILITY
3	Priority [ <del>will</del> ] <u>shall</u> be given to [ <del>New Mexico students from</del>
4	those groups with the most severe underrepresentation and]
5	students who are New Mexico residents with the greatest
6	financial need and students from groups underrepresented in
7	graduate education. A scholarship may be awarded to [ <del>an</del>
8	individual] a New Mexico resident who:
9	A. [ <del>is a citizen of the United States or who has a</del>
10	permanent resident visa] has earned a bachelor's degree and
11	maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0
12	scale or who holds a paid position supporting faculty teaching
13	or research activities;
14	B. has met the admission requirements, [ <del>and</del> ] is
15	accepted for enrollment [ <del>as a full-time student in an</del>
16	underrepresented] and enrolls in at least six credit hours in a
17	graduate [ <del>or professional</del> ] field of study [ <del>as determined by the</del>
18	institution]; and
19	C. has complied with all the rules [ <del>and</del>
20	regulations] adopted by the [commission] department for award
21	of the scholarship and the provisions regarding the
22	administration of [ <del>state</del> ] <u>the</u> graduate [ <del>scholarships adopted</del>
23	pursuant to the Graduate Scholarship Act; and
24	D. agrees to serve in an unpaid internship or
25	assistantship at the eligible institution, a government agency

Except as provided in Subsection B of this 7 section, a scholarship may be reawarded to a student who: 8  $[A_{\cdot}]$  (1) has been an award recipient of a New 9 Mexico graduate scholarship the previous year; 10  $[B_{\cdot}]$  (2) maintains a grade point average of 11 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and remains in good academic 12 standing as determined by the institution; and 13 [C.] (3) is enrolled [as a full-time graduate 14 student as determined by the institution; 15 D. is pursuing the second year of a master's degree 16 or the second or third year of a doctoral degree; and 17 E. agrees to serve in an unpaid internship or 18 assistantship at the eligible institution, a government agency 19 or private industry approved by his major department for ten 20 hours per week during the academic year] in at least six credit 21 hours in a graduate field of study. 22 B. 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1 SECTION 4. Section 21-21G-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 2 Chapter 111, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: 3 "21-21G-7. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--Scholarship [awards shall be for seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$7,200) per 4 5 year to be disbursed in equal installments over the period of 6 an academic year] award amounts shall not exceed one hundred 7 percent of tuition and fees for the graduate program at the 8 eligible institution for the academic year; provided that the 9 department shall fund only one semester at a time and shall not 10 fund the second semester of the academic year if the student 11 does not enroll for that semester or does not maintain 12 eligibility." 13 Section 21-21G-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, SECTION 5. 14 Chapter 111, Section 10, as amended) is amended to read: 15 "21-21G-10. TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--A scholarship 16 is terminated upon the occurrence of: 17 A. withdrawal from the eligible institution by the 18 award recipient or failure to reenroll for consecutive academic 19 years or [failure to be a full-time graduate student; or] the 20 second semester of an academic year; 21 B. failure to maintain the required grade point 22 average and other qualifications for the scholarship; or 23 [B.] C. substantial noncompliance by the award 24 recipient with the Graduate Scholarship Act or the rules 25 [regulations] or procedures promulgated by the [commission] .229023.1

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
