15	SECTION 1. A new section of Chapter 30, Article 6 NMSA
16	1978 is enacted to read:
17	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CYBERBULLYINGPENALTIES
18	A. Cyberbullying consists of a person communicating
19	directly or indirectly, in writing or electronically, with a
20	public school or private school student with reckless disregard
21	that the communication may have the effect of:
22	(1) placing the student in reasonable fear of
23	physical harm;
24	(2) causing a substantially detrimental effect
25	on the student's physical or mental health;

Whoever commits cyberbullying when the 12 cyberbullying results in great physical harm is guilty of a third degree felony. 13 14 Ε. Whoever commits cyberbullying when the 15 cyberbullying results in death is guilty of a second degree 16 felony. 17 As used in this section: F. 18 (1)"great physical harm" means physical harm 19 of a type that causes physical loss of a bodily member or organ 20 or functional loss of a bodily member or organ for a prolonged 21 period of time; 22 "great psychological harm" means (2) 23 psychological harm that causes mental or emotional 24 incapacitation for a prolonged period of time or that causes 25 extreme behavioral change or severe physical symptoms that .229486.2SA
