15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public School Code is
17	enacted to read:
18	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] FIREARM DETECTION SOFTWARE FUNDGRANTS TO
19	PUBLIC SCHOOLS
20	A. The "firearm detection software fund" is created
21	as a nonreverting fund in the state treasury. The fund
22	consists of appropriations, gifts, grants, donations, income
23	from investment of the fund and other revenue credited to the

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the firearm detection software fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2026 and subsequent fiscal years to provide grants to school districts and charter schools in accordance with the provisions of the fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund. - 3 -.228632.2
