20	A. When the board or any of its authorized	
21	representatives finds pursuant to Section 77-3-13 NMSA 1978	
22	that a disease has become epidemic or exists in a locality in a	
23	country, state or territory beyond the limits of this state,	
24	the board or any of its authorized representatives may deny	
25	access to the following information regarding persons involved

1 with the livestock industry if the dissemination of such 2 information would cause harm to such persons or would be 3 contrary to the public interest: 4 specific operational details of livestock (1) 5 operations, including: 6 (a) ownership, numbers, locations and 7 movements of livestock; 8 financial information; (b) 9 (c) the purchase and sale of livestock; 10 (d) account numbers or unique 11 identifiers issued by government or private entities; 12 operational protocols; and (e) 13 (f) participation in an all-hazards 14 security system; 15 information related to livestock disease (2) 16 or injury that: 17 (a) would identify a person or location; 18 or 19 (b) contains confidential data pursuant 20 to the veterinarian-patient-client privilege pursuant to 21 Subsection S of Section 16.25.3.8 NMAC; and 22 (3) records of ongoing investigations that 23 pertain to livestock. 24 Information shall not be withheld pursuant to Β. 25 Subsection A of this section if an investigation by the board .229457.2 - 2 -

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1 has concluded and the person being investigated is found by the 2 board or its authorized representatives to have violated any 3 provision of The Livestock Code that pertains to livestock. 4 If access to information is denied pursuant to C. 5 Subsection A of this section, the board or any of its 6 authorized representatives shall redact confidential 7 information and make the remaining information available for 8 disclosure. 9 D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 10 authorize the board or any of its authorized representatives to 11 obtain information not otherwise permitted by law. 12 Nothing in this section shall: Ε. 13 (1)preclude a person in interest from 14 accessing the person's own information; 15 (2) prevent the release of biological 16 livestock samples to authorized third-party entities for 17 scientific testing, so long as the testing entity agrees to 18 maintain the confidentiality of the information it receives; or 19 (3) apply when the board or its authorized 20 representatives determine that disclosure of livestock 21 information is necessary to prevent or address an immediate 22 threat to the health and safety of a person or animal. 23 When disclosing information pursuant to F. 24 Subsection E of this section, the board or its authorized 25 representatives shall release only as much information as is .229457.2 - 3 -
