## SUMMARY

### Synopsis of Senate Bill 518

Senate Bill 518 (SB518) appropriates \$100 thousand from the general fund to the University of New Mexico (UNM) for the purpose of supporting the maternity and infant care program (\$50 thousand) and the young children's health center (\$50 thousand).

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect 90 days after the Legislature adjourns if enacted, or June 20, 2025.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$100 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY26 shall revert to the general fund.

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

UNM reports:

The YCHC [young children's health center] is a community-based pediatric clinic that provides comprehensive health services to families with children from birth to young adulthood residing in the southeast heights of Albuquerque. Staff is bilingual Spanish/English in order to better serve the community. Special components of this clinic

include home visitation to families with babies 0-36 months, behavioral health services, case management, and outreach activities to local schools and the community center, which includes gang prevention and intervention and other neighboring activities.
