A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO CREATE A  
SPECIAL INTERIM COMMITTEE DEDICATED TO EXAMINING ISSUES  
PRESENTED BY ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TECHNOLOGY AND DEVELOPING  
LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS FOR THE REGULATION OF THE TECHNOLOGY AND  
THE PROTECTION OF DATA PRIVACY.

WHEREAS, artificial intelligence is rapidly transforming  
industries, government operations, health care, education and  
daily life, offering significant economic and social benefits  
while also raising concerns regarding bias, security,  
transparency, workforce displacement and ethical implications;  
and

WHEREAS, the collection, use and sharing of personal data  
have become increasingly complex, leading to growing concerns  
about consumer privacy, data security, digital rights and the

2 public entities; and

3 WHEREAS, the absence of comprehensive data privacy laws in  
4 New Mexico places residents at risk of unauthorized data  
5 collection, breaches and exploitation, and businesses lack  
6 clear regulatory guidance on responsible data practices; and

7 WHEREAS, several states have enacted or are considering  
8 comprehensive data-privacy- and artificial-intelligence-related  
9 legislation, and New Mexico must evaluate these developments to  
10 ensure its policies align with national and global best  
11 practices while reflecting the state's unique needs; and

12 WHEREAS, New Mexico is home to national laboratories,  
13 research institutions and a growing technology sector; and

14 WHEREAS, because of the state's technology sector, it is  
15 critical for the state to proactively engage in artificial  
16 intelligence and data privacy policy discussions to foster  
17 responsible innovation and economic growth; and

18 WHEREAS, artificial intelligence and data privacy  
19 regulations impact numerous stakeholders, including businesses,  
20 consumers, educators, health care providers and government  
21 agencies, necessitating a broad and inclusive approach to  
22 policymaking; and

23 WHEREAS, the establishment of a special legislative  
24 committee would provide a structured forum for experts,  
25 industry leaders, public interest groups and community members

1 to offer insights and ensure that artificial intelligence and  
2 data privacy policies are well-informed and effectively address  
3 potential risks and opportunities;

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE  
5 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico legislative council be  
6 requested to create a special interim legislative committee  
7 during the 2025 interim to hold hearings, gather testimony from  
8 stakeholders and develop recommendations for legislation in the  
9 2026 legislative session that addresses artificial intelligence  
10 development, deployment and regulation, as well as  
11 comprehensive data privacy protections for New Mexico  
12 residents; and

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special interim  
14 legislative committee be requested to discuss artificial  
15 intelligence and comprehensive data privacy legislation,  
16 including an examination of existing and proposed federal,  
17 state and international approaches to artificial intelligence  
18 governance and data protection; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be  
20 transmitted to the governor, the director of the legislative  
21 council service, the New Mexico legislative council, the  
22 secretary of information technology, the directors of New  
23 Mexico's national laboratories, the presidents or chancellors  
24 of the state's post-secondary educational institutions,  
25 representatives of the state's technology businesses and
