AN ACT

CREATING A JOINT INTERIM AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE TASK FORCE: MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE TASK FORCE CREATED --TERMINATION. -- There is created a joint interim legislative, executive, judicial and public member task force which shall be known as the "automobile insurance task force". The task force shall function from the date of its appointment until the first day of December prior to the first session of the forty-third legislature.

Section 2. MEMBERSHI P-- APPOI NTMENT-- VACANCI ES. --

The automobile insurance task force shall be composed of seventeen voting members, including eight legislative members. Four members of the house of

representatives shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, and four members of the senate shall be appointed by the committees' committee of the senate or, if the senate appointments are made in the interim, by the president pro tempore of the senate after consultation with and agreement of a majority of the members of the committees' committee.

B. Members shall be appointed from each house so as

- B. Members shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the task force as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less than one member from each house on the task force. Vacancies on the task force shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments. The chairman and vice chairman of the task force shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate.
- C. No action shall be taken by the task force if a majority of the total legislative membership from either house on the task force rejects the action.
 - D. The additional nine voting members shall be:
- (1) the three state corporation commissioners or their designees;
- (2) the director of the motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue department;
- (3) a metropolitan or magistrate court judge appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court;

- (4) the secretary of public safety or his designee;
 - (5) the attorney general or his designee; and
- (6) two public members to represent consumer interests, one appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and one appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate.
- E. The public members shall be paid per diem and mileage in accordance with the provisions of the Per Diem and Mileage Act.
- F. The speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate may appoint an advisory group to the task force of nonvoting persons that includes representatives of interests and organizations concerned about automobile insurance, including trial lawyers and the automobile insurance industry.

Section 3. DUTIES. --

- A. After its appointment, the automobile insurance task force shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval.
- B. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative council, the task force shall examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, regulations, court decisions and

elsewhere and recommend legislation or changes if any are found to be necessary to the first session of the forty-third legislature. The task force shall seek in its study to determine why automobile insurance rates are at the level they are in New Mexico; investigate whether, and if so, why those rates are disproportionately high; assess what options are reasonably available to lower the rates; determine what percentage of New Mexicans are uninsured, and what options may be pursued to decrease that percentage; consider what options are in general available to address automobile insurance problems in New Mexico, including the advantages and disadvantages of each; address concerns about competition in the marketplace, fraudulent practices and their impact on rates; and review how enforcement of effective automobile insurance laws can be achieved, including consideration of effective methods working in other states.

Section 4. SUBCOMMITTEES. -- Subcommittees shall be created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the automobile insurance task force and with the prior approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a subcommittee shall be approved by

the full task force in advance of the meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the task force.

Section 5. REPORT. -- The automobile insurance task force shall make a report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the first session of the forty-third legislature. The report and suggested legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico legislative council on or before December 15 preceding that session.

Section 6. STAFF.--The staff for the automobile insurance task force shall be provided by the legislative council service, and the staff of the department of insurance and other state agencies shall provide assistance as requested. The legislative council service, at the direction of the task force, may hire additional staff as necessary and contract with experts to assist the task force in carrying out its tasks.

Section 7. APPROPRIATION.--For the purpose of paying the salaries and expenses of the technical, professional, legal, clerical and stenographic assistants; for necessary equipment and supplies used in carrying out the provisions of this act; and for reimbursing the per diem and mileage expenses of the automobile insurance task force, there is appropriated to the legislative council service from the general fund the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). All or any part of this appropriation may be expended in fiscal years 1996 and 1997, and

any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1997 shall revert to the general fund. **Payments** from the appropriation shall be made upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or his authorized representative.

EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public Section 8. peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
