AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR THE CHACO WASH POWERLINE EXTENSION AND BATHROOM ADDITION IN THE SOUTH HOGBACK AND TABLE MESA AREAS OF THE HOGBACK CHAPTER OF THE NAVAJO NATION IN SAN JUAN COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one hundred fifty-six thousand three hundred sixty dollars (\$156,360) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal .110738.1

Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs in the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (1) forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) for archaeological and legal surveys and environmental assessment for the Chaco Wash powerline extension in the Hogback community in San Juan county; and
- (2) one hundred eleven thousand three hundred sixty dollars (\$111,360) to design, construct and equip a bathroom addition project for the south Hogback area and the Table Mesa area of the Hogback chapter in San Juan county.
- B. If the New Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this section shall be void. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
