18	WHEREAS, the arts and humanities embody the diverse
19	cultures of New Mexico and are the source of our cultural and
20	spiritual identities and the fabric of our community life and
21	traditional sources of strength for our families through
22	generations; and
23	WHEREAS, the arts and humanities are the foundations of our
24	cultural institutions and resources that contribute
25	significantly to the economy of our state, providing a primary

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1 reason for tourism in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, over fifty New Mexico towns, cities and communities benefit from services and programming provided by funding from these federal cultural agencies, and in 1995 over five million dollars (\$5,000,000) was distributed from these agencies throughout New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, disruption to continued funding for these federal cultural agencies seriously harms arts, humanities and cultural programs in New Mexico and would seriously damage our economy; and

WHEREAS, these federal cultural agencies provide funding for both large and small cultural organizations in New Mexico, which generate over one billion dollars (\$1,000,000,000) in economic activity; and

WHEREAS, cultural tourism is the fastest growing economic market in the country and is repeatedly cited by visitors as the leading reason for visiting a community and is especially important throughout New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, funding for these federal cultural agencies assures broad access to arts, humanities and cultural activities in rural and urban areas guaranteeing New Mexicans, regardless of income, the opportunity to participate and seek their livelihood in cultural activities; and

WHEREAS, each year programs and services produced by funding from these federal cultural agencies provide educational

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1 opportunities for New Mexico's schoolchildren;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE 2 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the congressional delegation be 3 encouraged to support prompt passage of the appropriation bills 4 5 or specially targeted appropriations to ensure funding at levels 6 agreed to by the conference committees for all federal cultural agencies, including the national endowment for the humanities, 7 the national endowment for the arts, the corporation for public 8 9 broadcasting, the institute for museum services and the 10 Smithsonian institutions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copes of this memorial be sent to members of the New Mexico congressional delegation, Senators Pete V. Domenici and Jeff Bingaman and Representatives Bill Richardson, Joe Skeen and Steven H. Schiff.
