## A JOINT MEMORIAL

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL 49

REQUESTING THAT PRESIDENT CLINTON RENEGOTIATE THE TERMS OF THE TREATY BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES ON THE EXECUTION OF PENAL SENTENCES.

WHEREAS, the New Mexico correctional system has an inmate population that threatens to exceed the rated capacity of available correctional facilities; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico correctional system remains subject to supervision by the United States district court, pursuant to the provisions of the <u>Duran</u> consent decree; and

WHEREAS, the <u>Duran</u> consent decree will not be vacated until the state of New Mexico addresses its inmate population problem; and

WHEREAS, one method for alleviating the immate population problem would be to transfer Mexican nationals currently

incarcerated in the New Mexico correctional system back to Mexico; and

WHEREAS, on September 25, 1995 there were at least two hundred twenty-eight Mexican nationals incarcerated in the New Mexico correctional system at an approximate cost of twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000) annually per inmate; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the "Treaty Between the United States of America and the United Mexican States on the Execution of Penal Sentences", a Mexican national incarcerated in the United States may be transferred to Mexico only if the offender gives his express consent for the transfer; and

WHEREAS, renegotiation of that provision, and perhaps others in the treaty, would make it easier to transfer Mexican nationals incarcerated in New Mexico back to Mexico;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that President Clinton be respectfully requested to renegotiate the terms of the "Treaty Between the United States of America and the United Mexican States on the Execution of Penal Sentences" to make it easier to transfer Mexican nationals incarcerated in New Mexico back to Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States senate be respectfully requested to concur with the proposed changes to the treaty, as prescribed in Article 3, Section 2 of the constitution of the United States; and
