A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE PROGRAM OF ALL-INCLUSIVE CARE FOR THE ELDERLY OR SIMILAR PROGRAMS BE INCORPORATED INTO THE PRIORITY PACKAGE FOR STATE MEDIGRANT FUNDING AND THE STATE'S LONG-TERM CARE POLICY, THAT THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT BE ASKED TO DEVELOP A CAPITATION RATE FOR MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE PROGRAM OF ALL-INCLUSIVE CARE FOR THE ELDERLY OR SIMILAR CARE PROVIDERS AND THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH BE ASKED TO DEVELOP LICENSING AND CERTIFICATION STANDARDS FOR THOSE PROVIDERS.

WHEREAS, the 1994 legislature appropriated funding to the state agency on aging to conduct a feasibility study to determine whether the program of all-inclusive care for the elderly could be implemented to provide comprehensive acute and long-term care services to New Mexico's frail elders; and

WHEREAS, the feasibility study determined the viability of

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1 the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly; and

2 WHEREAS, the New Mexico frail elder consortium, including
3 representatives from state government, the aging network,
4 advocacy organizations, private health care providers, consumers
5 and family members, was established to support the development
6 of the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly and to
7 develop a community-based service system for older adults; and

8 WHEREAS, the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly
9 provides a service system that enables frail elders to remain in
10 their own homes and communities, preventing costly and unwanted
11 institutionalization; and

12 WHEREAS, the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly
13 has yielded a five percent to fifteen percent savings in
14 medicaid expenditures in states where the program is currently
15 operating and is projected to yield a savings of at least ten
16 percent for New Mexico's medicaid program; and

17 WHEREAS, the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly
18 initiative combines public and private resources and expertise,
19 including the expertise of consumers, to more fully address the
20 long-term care needs of New Mexico's communities;

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
22 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the program for all-inclusive care for
23 the elderly or similar programs be incorporated into the
24 priority package for state medigrant funding and the state's
25 long-term care policy; and

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department
2 be asked to develop a capitation rate for medicaid reimbursement
3 for the program for all-inclusive care for the elderly and
4 similar care providers; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health be
6 asked to develop licensing and certification standards for the
7 program for all-inclusive care for the elderly and similar care
8 providers; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state of New Mexico
10 implement at least one program for all-inclusive care for the
11 elderly or similar programs in fiscal year 1996; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
13 transmitted to the secretaries of human services and health.
