A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO ENFORCE CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS THAT ARE OWED TO RECIPIENTS OF AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN BEFORE TIME LIMITS ARE IMPOSED ON RECIPIENTS' RECEIVING PROGRAM BENEFITS.

WHEREAS, there are approximately seventy-five thousand cases pending at the human services department of individuals who owe child support payments; and

WHEREAS, over ninety percent of recipients of aid to families with dependent children are not receiving child support payments; and

WHEREAS, time limits imposed on recipients' receiving aid to families with dependent children benefits will not lead to self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS, time limits imposed on recipients' receiving aid

to families with dependent children benefits will only harm the children of these recipients; and

WHEREAS, payment of child support to recipients of aid to families with dependent children who are entitled to receive those payments may assist recipients in leaving the public assistance program; and

WHEREAS, enforcement of child support payments by the human services department for recipients of aid to families with dependent children is one way to assist these recipients in leaving the public assistance program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department be requested to enforce child support payments that are owed to recipients of aid to families with dependent children before time limits are imposed on recipients' receiving program benefits: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the secretary of human services.
