A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE, JUDICIAL AND EXECUTIVE BRANCHES OF GOVERNMENT TO ENSURE THAT THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO HAS A STATE-OF-THE-ART TELECOMMUNICATIONS NETWORK BY THE YEAR 2001.

WHEREAS, New Mexico is enjoying unprecedented population and economic growth that far outstrips the national average, yet New Mexico also remains one of the most rural states in the union; and

WHEREAS, this dichotomy presents unique challenges to meet and serve the telecommunications needs of a diverse population that ranges from nuclear physicists to isolated ranchers; and

WHEREAS, the citizens and government of New Mexico have consistently demonstrated their commitment to education and schools by providing generous funding and state-of-the-art

learning technologies; and

WHEREAS, the citizens and government of New Mexico are committed to affordable telecommunications service for all New Mexicans: and

WHEREAS, the state of New Mexico has a substantial interest in attracting research, education, industry and technology at higher and higher levels to ensure that New Mexico continues to be the pre-eminent state in the west; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 has changed the regulatory and competitive environments for telecommunications in an effort to promote competition and reduce regulation that will secure lower prices and higher quality services for American telecommunications consumers and encourage rapid deployment of new telecommunications technologies; and

WHEREAS, access to, connection with, and inclusion in the rapidly evolving telecommunications network is not a luxury but is a necessity if New Mexico is to fulfill its commitment to its citizens, businesses and schools;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the three branches of the government of the state of New Mexico be requested to take all necessary and proper steps to ensure that by the year 2001, the state of New Mexico has access to all possible informational, technological and educational resources through a state-of-the-art

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the three branches of the government of the state of New Mexico be requested to take all necessary and proper steps to ensure universal

telecommunications service to all citizens of New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the three branches of the government of the state of New Mexico be requested to take all necessary and proper steps to protect New Mexico consumers by ensuring fair and equal application of regulations and rules to all telecommunications providers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be sent to the president pro tempore of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the chief justice of the supreme court and the governor.
