A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION ENDORSE AND COORDINATE WITH THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS A FEDERAL, STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT-SCHOOL TEACHER SUBSTITUTE PILOT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, a chronic shortage of qualified substitute teachers exists in the public school system; and

WHEREAS, it is difficult for public schools to attract qualified substitute teachers when the schools cannot provide high pay, job security or benefits to substitute teachers; and

WHEREAS, the lack of substitute teachers frequently requires classes to be combined or to be taught by unqualified people; and

WHEREAS, government employees and retired employees comprise a large pool of highly qualified potential substitute

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the state department of public education develop and coordinate with the public schools a pilot program to utilize such volunteers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the state board of education, the state superintendent of public instruction, the local public school boards and the local superintendents of public education.
