RELATI NG TO PUBLI C SCHOOLS; SPECI FYI NG A MAXI MUM STUDENT CLASS SI ZE; PROVI DI NG FOR I NCREASED OPPORTUNI TI ES FOR STUDENTS TO LEARN; AMENDI NG SECTI ON 22-2-8. 2 NMSA 1978 (BEI NG LAMS 1986, CHAPTER 33, SECTI ON 3, AS AMENDED).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGI SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-2-8. 2 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1986, Chapter 33, Section 3 , as amended) is amended to read:
"22-2-8. 2. STAFFI NG PATTERNS- - CLASS LOAD- TEACHI NG LOAD. --
A. The i ndi vi dual class load for el ement ary school teachers shall not exceed twenty students for ki nder garten; provi ded that any teacher in ki ndergarten with a class load of fifteen to twenty students shall be entitled to the assistance of an instructional assistant.

B. The average class load for el ementary school teachers at an indi vidual school shall not exceed twenty-two st udents when aver aged among grades one, two and three [ provided that]. The maxi mum i ndi vi dual cl ass si ze shall not exceed twenty-five students for grades one, two and three. Any teacher in grade one with a class load of twent y-one or more shall be entitled to the full-time assistance of an instructional assi stant.
C. Effective with the 1994-95 school year, the average class load for an el ement ary school teacher at an indi vi dual school shall not exceed twenty-four students when aver aged among grades four, five and six. The maximum indi vi dual class size shall not exceed twenty-five students for grades four, five and six.
D. The daily teaching load per teacher for grades seven through twel ve shall not exceed one hundred sixty students, except the daily teaching load for teachers of requi red English courses in grades seven and ei ght shal l not exceed one hundred thirty-five with a maxi mum of twent y-seven students per cl ass and the daily teaching load for teachers of required English courses in grades ni ne through twel ve shal I not exceed one hundred fifty students with a maximof thirty students per class. The maxi mumindi vi dual class size for English, math, science, soci al science and commeni cation skills in grades seven through twel ve shall not exceed thirty
st udent s.
E. Students recei ving special education services integrated into a regul ar classroomfor any part of the day shall be counted in the cal cul ation of cl ass load averages. St udents recei ving special education services not integrated into the regul ar classroomshall not be counted in the cal culation of class load averages. Onl y cl assroomteachers charged with responsi bility for the regul ar classroom instructional programshall be counted in determining average cl ass loads. In el ement ary school s offering only one grade I evel, average class loads may be cal cul at ed by averaging appropriate grade levels bet ween schools in the school district.
F. The state superintendent may wai ve the indi vi dual school class load requi rements established in this section. Wai vers shall be applied for annually and a wai ver shall not be granted for more than two consecutive years. hai vers may only be granted if a school di strict demonstrates:
(1) no portable classrooms are available;
(2) no ot her available sources of funding exist to meet its need for additional classrooms;
(3) the district is planning alternatives to i ncrease buil ding capacity for implementan within one year; and
(4) the parents of all children affected by
the wai ver have been notified in writing:
(a) of the statutory cl ass I oad
requi rements;
(b) that the school di strict has made a deci si on to devi ate fromthese class load requi rements; and
(c) of the school district pl an to achi eve compl iance with the class load requi rements.
G. If a wai ver is granted pursuant to Subsection $F$ of thi s section to an indi vidual school, the average class I oad for el ement ary school teachers at that school shall not exceed twenty students in grade one and shall not exceed twent $y$-five st udents when averaged among grades two, three, four, five and six.
H. Each school district shall report to the department of education the size and composition of cl asses subsequent to the fortieth day and the December 1 count. Failure to meet class load requi rements within two years shall be justification for the di sapproval of the school district's budget by the state superintendent.
I. The department of education shall report to the I egi slative education st udy committee by Novenber 30 of each year regarding each school district's ability to meet class I oad requi rements i mposed by I aw.
J. Not withstanding the provisions of Subsection F of this section, the state board may wai ve the indi vi dual
cl ass load and teaching load requi rements established in this section upon a demonstration of a viable alternative curricular pl an and a finding by the state board that the pl an is in the best interest of the school district and that, on an annual basis, the plan has been presented to and is supported by the affected teaching staff. The department of education shall eval uate the i mpact of each alternative curricular pl an annually. Annual reports shall be made to the legi slative education study committee.
K. Effective with the 1987-88 school year, certified school instructors shall not be required to perform noni nstructional duties except in emergency situations as defined by the state board. For purposes of this subsection, "noni nstructional duties" means noon hall duty, noon ground duty and noon cafeteria duty."
