A MEMORIAL

DECLARING MARCH 1 AS COMMUNITY COLLEGE DAY IN THE LEGISLATURE.

WHEREAS, community colleges in New Mexico are strategically located around the state for easy access to the post-secondary and lifelong learning needs of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, community colleges now educate and train fiftythree thousand New Mexicans in credit programs, or fifty-three percent of the total higher education student population, and another estimated seventy-five thousand New Mexicans in noncredit adult and continuing education; and
