RELATING TO TAXATION; AMENDING THE RURAL HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER TAX CREDIT TO ALLOW THE SAME AMOUNT OF CREDIT FOR ALL PRACTITIONERS; MAKING LICENSED COUNSELORS, PHARMACISTS AND SOCIAL WORKERS ELIGIBLE FOR THE RURAL HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER TAX CREDIT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 7-2-18.22 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2007, Chapter 361, Section 2) is amended to read:

"7-2-18.22. [~~TAX CREDIT~~] RURAL HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER TAX CREDIT.--

A. A taxpayer who files an individual New Mexico tax return, who is not a dependent of another individual, who is an eligible health care practitioner and who has provided health care services in New Mexico in a rural health care

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1 underserved area in a taxable year may claim a credit against
2 the tax liability imposed by the Income Tax Act. The credit
3 provided in this section may be referred to as the "rural
4 health care practitioner tax credit".

5 B. The rural health care practitioner tax credit
6 may be claimed and allowed in an amount that shall not exceed
7 five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for all eligible [~~physicians,~~
8 ~~osteopathic physicians, dentists, clinical psychologists,~~
9 ~~podiatrists and optometrists who qualify pursuant to the~~
10 ~~provisions of this section, except the credit shall not exceed~~
11 ~~three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for all eligible dental~~
12 ~~hygienists, physician assistants, certified nurse-midwives,~~
13 ~~certified registered nurse anesthetists, certified nurse~~
14 ~~practitioners and clinical nurse specialists] health care
15 practitioners.~~

16 C. To qualify for the rural health care
17 practitioner tax credit, an eligible health care practitioner
18 shall have provided health care during a taxable year for at
19 least two thousand eighty hours at a practice site located in
20 an approved, rural health care underserved area. An eligible
21 rural health care practitioner who provided health care
22 services for at least one thousand forty hours but less than
23 two thousand eighty hours at a practice site located in an
24 approved rural health care underserved area during a taxable
25 year is eligible for one-half of the credit amount.

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1 D. Before an eligible health care practitioner may
2 claim the rural health care practitioner tax credit, the
3 practitioner shall submit an application to the department of
4 health that describes the practitioner's clinical practice and
5 contains additional information that the department of health
6 may require. The department of health shall determine whether
7 an eligible health care practitioner qualifies for the rural
8 health care practitioner tax credit and shall issue a
9 certificate to each qualifying eligible health care
10 practitioner. The department of health shall provide the
11 taxation and revenue department appropriate information for all
12 eligible health care practitioners to whom certificates are
13 issued.

14 E. A taxpayer claiming the credit provided by this
15 section shall submit a copy of the certificate issued by the
16 department of health with the taxpayer's New Mexico income tax
17 return for the taxable year. If the amount of the credit
18 claimed exceeds a taxpayer's tax liability for the taxable year
19 in which the credit is being claimed, the excess may be carried
20 forward for three consecutive taxable years.

21 F. As used in this section:

22 (1) "eligible health care practitioner" means:

23 (a) a certified nurse-midwife licensed
24 by the board of nursing as a registered nurse and licensed by
25 the public health division of the department of health to

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1 practice nurse-midwifery as a certified nurse-midwife;

2 (b) a dentist or dental hygienist
3 licensed pursuant to the Dental Health Care Act;

4 (c) an optometrist licensed pursuant to
5 the provisions of the Optometry Act;

6 (d) an osteopathic physician licensed
7 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 61, Article 10 NMSA 1978
8 or an osteopathic physician assistant licensed pursuant to the
9 provisions of the Osteopathic Physicians' Assistants Act;

10 (e) a physician or physician assistant
11 licensed pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 61, Article 6
12 NMSA 1978;

13 (f) a podiatrist licensed pursuant to
14 the provisions of the Podiatry Act;

15 (g) a clinical psychologist licensed
16 pursuant to the provisions of the Professional Psychologist
17 Act; ~~[and]~~

18 (h) a registered nurse in advanced
19 practice who has been prepared through additional formal
20 education as provided in Sections 61-3-23.2 through 61-3-23.4
21 NMSA 1978 to function beyond the scope of practice of
22 professional registered nursing, including certified nurse
23 practitioners, certified registered nurse anesthetists and
24 clinical nurse specialists;

25 (i) a person licensed pursuant to the

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1 Counseling and Therapy Practice Act;

2 (j) a pharmacist licensed pursuant to
3 the Pharmacy Act; and

4 (k) a social worker licensed pursuant to
5 the Social Work Practice Act;

6 (2) "health care underserved area" means a
7 geographic area or practice location in which it has been
8 determined by the department of health, through the use of
9 indices and other standards set by the department of health,
10 that sufficient health care services are not being provided;

11 (3) "practice site" means a private practice,
12 public health clinic, hospital, public or private nonprofit
13 primary care clinic or other health care service location in a
14 health care underserved area; and

15 (4) "rural" means an area or location
16 identified by the department of health as falling outside of an
17 urban area."

18 SECTION 2. APPLICABILITY.--The provisions of this act
19 apply to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2016.
