13	ONE FULL-TIME, LICENSED REGISTERED SCHOOL NURSE; MAKING AN
14	APPROPRIATION.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 22-8-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967,
18	Chapter 16, Section 63, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"22-8-9. BUDGETSMINIMUM REQUIREMENTS
20	A. A budget for a school district shall not be
21	approved by the department that does not provide for:
22	(1) a school year and school day as provided
23	in Section 22-2-8.1 NMSA 1978; [and]
24	(2) a pupil-teacher ratio or class or teaching
25	load as provided in Section 22-10A-20 NMSA 1978; and
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1	(3) a full-time, department-licensed
2	registered school nurse employed in the school district.
3	B. The department shall, by rule, establish the
4	requirements for an instructional day, the standards for an
5	instructional hour, [and] the standards for a full-time teacher
6	and for the equivalent thereof.
7	C. Except as provided in Subsection D of this
8	section, the department shall promulgate rules for the
9	implementation of the minimum requirement for a full-time,
10	department-licensed registered school nurse in all school
11	<u>districts in New Mexico.</u>
12	D. The department may promulgate rules to allow for
13	a waiver of the requirement in Paragraph (3) of Subsection A of
14	this section for a rural school district with a student MEM of
15	less than two hundred fifty; provided that:
16	(1) the school district demonstrates that it
17	can meet the requirements of this section by hiring a part-
18	time, department-licensed registered school nurse; or
19	(2) the school district:
20	(a) is not able to hire a qualified
21	nurse or contract with a third party for a qualified nurse
22	because of insufficient availability of such nurses in its
23	geographic vicinity; and
24	(b) requesting a waiver documents its
25	unsuccessful attempts to hire or contract with a department-
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licensed, registered school nurse."

2	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION One million six hundred fifty		
3	thousand dollars (\$1,650,000) is appropriated from the general		
4	fund to the public education department for expenditure in		
5	fiscal year 2018 to assist school districts that have student		
6	enrollments of less than two hundred fifty MEM to employ a		
7	department-licensed registered school nurse for the 2017-2018		
8	school year. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining		
9	at the end of fiscal year 2018 shall revert to the general		
10	fund.		
11	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the		
12	provisions of this act is July 1, 2017.		
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
