19	A. The aging and long-term services department
20	shall permit any senior center, as defined in rules promulgated
21	by the department, to coordinate the planting, cultivation,
22	growing, tending and harvesting by senior center staff and
23	senior participants of edible fruits and vegetables on the
24	senior center's premises for inclusion in food service or
25	distribution to senior participants.

The aging and long-term services department 2 shall authorize the building, maintenance and use of structures 3 that extend the growing season of edible fruits and vegetables, including greenhouses and hoop houses, for the purposes 4 outlined in Subsection A of this section. 5 No later than September 1, 2019, the aging and 6 C. 7 long-term services department shall adopt rules that allow for 8 food gardens as described in Subsections A and B of this 9 section. The rules shall include and address: 10 D. applicable state and federal guidelines; (1)11 12 (2) the avoidance of microbial contamination of fruits and vegetables grown at the senior citizen 13 14 facilities; the quality of water and types of (3) 15 fertilizer that can be used in gardens at the senior citizen 16 17 facilities; the types of fruits and vegetables that (4) 18 19 can be grown for consumption at the senior citizen facilities; 20 (5) training for senior participants and staff regarding safe handling, cooking and preservation techniques; 21 both conventional and organic growing (6) 22 methods; and 23 other factors needed to ensure that good (7) 24 agricultural practices are used in the growing of fruits and 25 .211560.1 - 2 -
