Β. five years, if the person is in possession of more than five hundred pills, capsules or tablets containing a 7 detectable amount of fentanyl, regardless of its concentration, 8 or more than fifty grams of fentanyl powder, whichever is less; 9 or

five years, if the person has recruited, C. coordinated, organized, supervised, directed, managed or financed another to commit trafficking fentanyl pursuant to Section 30-31-20 NMSA 1978. The enhancement shall be in addition to, not a replacement of, charging conspiracy to commit trafficking pursuant to Section 30-28-2 NMSA 1978."
