17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLEThis act may be
18	cited as the "Closed Captioning Act".
19	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONSAs used in the
20	Closed Captioning Act:
21	A. "closed captioning" means a transcript or
22	written dialogue of the audio portion of a television program
23	that is displayed on the screen of a television receiver;
24	B. "place of public accommodation" means any
25	governmental entity or any establishment that provides or

C. "public area" means any part of a place of public accommodation that is open to the general public;

D. "regular hours" means the hours of the day in
which a place of public accommodation is generally open to
members of the general public;

E. "television program" means any recorded media that has audio and visual components and is displayed on a television receiver; and

13 F. "television receiver" means a device that is 14 capable of displaying a television program. "Television 15 receiver" includes:

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16 a television; (1) 17 a display screen; (2) 18 a digital set top box; (3) 19 a monitor; and (4) 20 any other technology capable of displaying (5) 21 closed captioning for a television program. 22 SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] CLOSED CAPTIONING IN PLACES OF 23 PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION .-- A person that owns or manages a place of public accommodation shall activate closed captioning on all 24 25 television receivers that are turned on and operating in public .230511.3

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1 areas during regular hours, except when: 2 the television program or television receiver Α. 3 available in the public area is not technologically able to 4 display closed captioning; 5 the television program being displayed is exempt Β. from closed captioning requirements under federal law; or 6 7 C. multiple television receivers are displaying the 8 same television program, in which case only one television 9 receiver is required to display closed captioning. 10 SECTION 4. [NEW MATERIAL] ENFORCEMENT--PRIVATE RIGHT OF 11 ACTION.--12 A person found to have knowingly and willfully Α. 13 violated the provisions of the Closed Captioning Act shall be 14 subject to a civil penalty not to exceed: one dollar (\$1.00) for the first 15 (1) 16 violation; 17 (2) fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the second 18 violation; and 19 two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for a (3) 20 third or subsequent violation. 21 Β. Any individual with an auditory disability who 22 is unable to access closed captioning for a television program 23 due to violations of the Closed Captioning Act shall have the right to file a civil action in a court of competent 24 25 jurisdiction. The individual may seek injunctive relief to .230511.3
