16	SECTION 1. Section 29-7C-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
17	Chapter 320, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"29-7C-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Public Safety
19	Telecommunicator Training Act:
20	A. "board" means the law enforcement certification
21	board;
22	B. "certified" means meeting the training standards
23	established by statute and rule as determined by the board;
24	C. "council" means the New Mexico law enforcement
25	standards and training council;

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1	D. "director" means the director of the New Mexico
2	law enforcement academy;
3	E. "dispatch" means the relay of information to
4	public safety personnel by all forms of communication;
5	F. "high-quality telecommunicator cardiopulmonary
6	resuscitation" means the instructions that a telecommunicator
7	provides to a bystander of a cardiac emergency on how to
8	perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation;
9	[F.] G. "safety agency" means a unit of state or
10	local government, a special purpose district or a private
11	business that provides police, firefighting or emergency
12	medical services; and
13	[$6.$] $H.$ "telecommunicator" means an employee or
14	volunteer of a safety agency who:
15	(1) receives calls or dispatches the
16	appropriate personnel or equipment in response to calls for
17	police, fire or medical services; and
18	(2) makes decisions affecting the life, health
19	or welfare of the public or safety employees."
20	SECTION 2. Section 29-7C-4.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,
21	Chapter 56, Section 19) is amended to read:
22	"29-7C-4.1. PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATOR TRAININGThe
23	curriculum of each basic telecommunicator training class and
24	in-service training each year for telecommunicators shall
25	include:

1	A. crisis management and intervention;
2	B. dealing with individuals who are experiencing
3	mental health issues;
4	C. methods of de-escalation;
5	D. peer-to-peer intervention;
6	E. stress management;
7	F. racial sensitivity; [and]
8	G. reality-based situational training; and
9	H. high-quality telecommunicator cardiopulmonary
10	resuscitation using the most current nationally recognized
11	emergency cardiovascular care guidelines. Training on high-
12	quality telecommunicator cardiopulmonary resuscitation shall
13	include instruction on out-of-hospital cardiac arrest protocols
14	and compression-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation."
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
