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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:			
19	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLESections 1			
20	through 4 of this act may be cited as the "Transparency in			
21	Government Contracting Act".			
22	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONSAs used in the			
23	Transparency in Government Contracting Act:			
24	A. "contract" means an agreement with a government			
25	agency for:

1 (1) the procurement of items of tangible personal property, services or construction pursuant to the 2 3 Procurement Code; and 4 the disbursement of federal, state or (2) 5 other funds in which the government agency grants or awards the 6 disbursement of those funds based upon a competitive grant or 7 applications received from individuals or entities other than government agencies; 8 9 "government agency" means: Β. 10 the New Mexico state government or a (1) 11 department, division, institution, board, bureau, commission or 12 committee of state government; and 13 (2) every political subdivision of the state 14 and the agencies, instrumentalities and institutions thereof, 15 including post-secondary educational institutions, school 16 districts and local school boards and municipalities; 17 C. "make available" means to provide access to the 18 public through a searchable online database or web page and 19 includes providing direct email notifications of contracts to 20 an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, association or 21 entity that has made such request in writing to the custodian 22 of records for that government agency; and 23 D. "protected information" means information that 24 is a trade secret, confidential, sealed or otherwise protected 25 by law from public disclosure.

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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete SECTION 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] GOVERNMENT AGENCY--SOLICITATION TO CONTRACT--PUBLIC DISCLOSURE--REQUIREMENTS.--

A. A government agency shall:

4 (1) make available the invitations for bids,
5 requests for proposals, requests for information or other
6 solicitations relating to a contract of that government agency
7 no later than one week after soliciting interested parties for
8 a contract;

9 (2) update the web pages associated with the 10 Transparency in Government Contracting Act as new information 11 is provided or received but at least monthly, including 12 information from the previous month or year, where relevant, 13 for comparison purposes and maintain the web page as the 14 primary source of public information about the contractual 15 activity of the government agency that is related to that act;

(3) include the name and contact information of the custodian of records of the government agency on the web page associated with the Transparency in Government Contracting Act;

(4) provide the department of information technology with a uniform resource locator or working link to the web page required by the Transparency in Government Contracting Act. At any time that the uniform resource locator or link is altered or changed, the government agency shall update the department of information technology; and

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1 make available any information relating to (5) emergency or sole source contract of the government agency. 2 3 Nothing in this section shall be construed to Β. 4 require the government agency to make available any protected 5 information." SECTION 4. [NEW MATERIAL] ENFORCEMENT--INVALID ACTIONS.--6 7 If the provisions of the Transparency in Α. 8 Government Contracting Act are knowingly and willfully 9 violated, the contract at issue shall be presumed invalid. 10 All provisions of the Transparency in Government Β. 11 Contracting Act shall be enforced by the attorney general or by 12 the district attorney in the county of jurisdiction. However, 13 nothing in that act shall prevent an individual from 14 independently applying for enforcement through the district 15 court. 16 C. The district court has jurisdiction, upon the 17 application of any person to enforce the purpose of the 18 Transparency in Government Contracting Act, by injunction, 19 mandamus or other appropriate order. 20 SECTION 5. Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, 21 Chapter 34, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read: 22 SUNSHINE PORTAL--DEPARTMENT DUTIES.--"10-16D-3. 23 The department, with the department of finance Α. 24 and administration, shall develop, operate and maintain a 25 single internet [web site] website that is free, user-friendly,

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1 searchable and accessible to the public, known as the "sunshine 2 portal", to host the state's financial information for the 3 purpose of governmental transparency and accountability to 4 taxpayers.

No later than October 1, 2010, the department 5 Β. shall create the architecture and the information exchange 6 7 process for the collection and electronic publication of the 8 state's financial information.

C. No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal 10 shall be available for public access and include updated 11 information as required by Subsection D of this section.

The sunshine portal shall provide, at a minimum, D. access to the following information:

the state's cash balances by account or (1)fund;

a monthly summary of the state's (2) investment accounts;

annual operating budgets for each state (3) agency with monthly expenditures by category;

contracts that a state agency enters into (4) for the lease, sale or development of state land and state contracts that have a total contract price of more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), naming the recipient of the contract, the purpose of the contract and the amounts expended. No later than January 1, 2017, the information provided shall .228614.2

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1 also include: 2 (a) the name of the recipient of the 3 contract; 4 the purpose of the contract; (b) 5 (c) the amounts expended on the contract; 6 7 (d) a copy of or an internet web site 8 link to a copy of the contract document, including amendments; 9 and 10 a copy of or an internet [web site] (e) 11 website link to a copy of a resident certificate issued 12 pursuant to Section 13-1-22 NMSA 1978 and used in the award of 13 a contract; 14 (5) the revenue that the state received in the 15 preceding month by source, such as type of tax, fee, fine, 16 administrative fee or other collection category; 17 (6) special appropriations received outside 18 the general appropriation act by each state agency and the 19 purpose of those appropriations; 20 approved budget adjustment requests by (7) 21 state agency and affected budget category; 22 quarterly consensus revenue estimates; (8) 23 (9) reversions and cash balances by state 24 agency and fund; 25 (10)appropriations for capital projects, .228614.2 - 6 -

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1 identified by project location, type of project and funding 2 source: 3 a directory of all employee positions, (11)4 other than exempt employee positions, identified only by state 5 agency, position title and salary; a directory of all exempt employee 6 (12) 7 positions, identified by state agency, position title, salary 8 and the name of the individual that holds the position; 9 (13)information relating to local education providers compiled and published by the public education 10 11 department pursuant to Section 10-16D-6 NMSA 1978; 12 a link to an open meeting tracker [web (14) 13 site] website upon which each state agency shall post open 14 meetings scheduled for the current month and the next month, 15 including the time and place of the meeting, the subject of the 16 meeting and an agenda; (15) a link to the [web site] website 17 18 maintained by the regulation and licensing department for the 19 purpose of accessing information relating to occupational 20 licenses; 21 (16) a link to the state auditor's [web site] 22 website for the purpose of accessing financial audits; 23 a link to New Mexico's statutes; (17)24 (18)a link to the New Mexico Administrative 25 Code; .228614.2 - 7 -

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1 (19) a link to the secretary of state's [web 2 sites] websites for lobbyist regulation; 3 (20) an annual summary within three months after the end of the fiscal year, or as soon thereafter as the 4 information becomes available, of the state's fiscal health, 5 including the state budget, revenues and expenditures for the 6 7 previous fiscal year and projected revenues and operating 8 budgets for the current fiscal year; 9 (21) a directory of the uniform resource 10 locators or links corresponding to each government agency provided to the department as required by the Transparency in 11 12 Government Contracting Act; and 13 [(21)] (22) additional information, as 14 required by rule of the department of finance and 15 administration, that will assist the public in understanding 16 state government operations and the use of taxpayer dollars. 17 Ε. State agencies shall provide updated financial 18 information as frequently as possible but at least monthly. 19 F. The department shall update the [web site] 20 website as new information is received but at least monthly, 21 include information from the previous month or year, where 22 relevant, for comparison purposes and maintain the [web site] 23 website as the primary source of public information about the 24 activity of the state government." 25 SECTION 6.
