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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public Assistance Act is
20	enacted to read:

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1 a person's quality of life; and "home-based health care" means health care 2 (2) 3 services provided to a person in the person's home or place of "Home-based health care" includes the following 4 residence. 5 services provided in a person's home or place of residence: 6 (a) skilled nursing; 7 (b) home health aide services; 8 palliative care; (c) 9 (d) primary care; 10 (e) personal care services; in-home respite care; 11 (f) 12 physical therapy; (g) 13 (h) occupational therapy; 14 (i) speech therapy; and 15 non-emergency medical (j) 16 transportation. 17 No later than August 1, 2025, the authority Β. 18 shall submit an application to the federal centers for medicare 19 and medicaid services for authorization to develop and 20 implement a medicaid waiver program that would provide home-21 based health care services to individuals who are sixty-five 22 years of age or older and diagnosed with a chronic debilitating 23 disease. If the federal centers for medicare and medicaid 24 services approves the waiver application, the authority shall 25 promulgate rules to implement and administer the waiver .230277.1 - 2 -

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1 program, subject to the availability of state funds and 2 consistent with the federal Social Security Act. The rules 3 shall:

(1) be developed in consultation with personswith chronic debilitating diseases and health care providers;

(2) create an application process to allowpeople to apply to participate in the waiver program; and

(3) provide for a system of home-based health care services that seniors with chronic debilitating diseases can access."

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Two million dollars (\$2,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the health care authority for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 and 2026 to develop a waiver application for a home-based health care program for people who are sixty-five years of age or older and diagnosed with a chronic debilitating disease. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2026 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
