Helping with our greater community during COVID-19 - Highlights

- Two different types of masks that allow members to continue playing while still reducing the spread of COVID-19
- Sold 12,000 masks to about nine different universities, including Oklahoma State and University of Massachusetts
- Raised \$12,000 for music scholarships at NMSU
- Includes a scholarship for designer Katelyn Zuments, uniform manager for the Pride of New Mexico and a sophomore mechanical engineering student at NMSU
- \$1 from each mask sale is going toward music scholarships at NMSU



- Board of Regent weekly updates









Fall Enrollment — Impact of COVID-19 Enrollment in Same Number of Days Approaching Fall Census as of Aug-23-2020







Measures to Protect Students, Faculty & Staff

- Testing & Contact Tracing

 - NMSU Produced Screening and Contact Tracing App and Portal
- Social Distancing
 - Classroom modifications
 - Reconfiguration of space
 - Traffic flow modifications
 - Tents
 - Vending machines for PPE


Should you return to NMSU this fall, what format would you prefer to take courses in?


All courses face to face 45.8% All courses online 26.1% Hybrid 28.0%


Student survey from 04/23/2020 to 05/03/2020. Survey of 4,169 students

NMSU Tuition

- New Mexico State University Board of Regents approved a 3 percent increase in tuition for the 2020-2021 - Las Cruces campus, primarily to cover student financial aid
- There was <u>no</u> increase in tuition for NMSU's community colleges
- Even with the increased tuition rate, NMSU's net price most affordable in the state and among the most competitive in the nation
- Main reasons for higher online tuition*
 - Added costs of online instruction and support services
 - Added cost of online course and program development
 - Added costs of online program marketing

CARES Act Funding

- NMSU system received \$14 million
 - \$7 million went directly to emergency aid grants to students
 - A total of 7645 students have received funding
 - Each student received approximately \$920
 - There is approximately \$3,900 remaining which will be awarded to some students who may be eligible and had not applied previously
 - Up to 50% or \$7 million may be used to cover institutional costs associated with the significant changes to the delivery of instruction due to the coronavirus.
 - \$1.3 million distributed to community colleges
 - Approx. \$3.2 million allocated to students as refunds on housing, meals, parking, etc.
 - Approx. \$4 million is being used for sanitization costs, IT capacity expansion, training for changes in instruction delivery, remote learning expansion
- Working with U.S. Department of Ed How MSI's are funded (Native American serving institutions)
- MSI Funding (Minority Serving Institutions)
 - \$1.04 million for NMSU
 - \$322,287 distributed to community colleges
 - COVID 19 Related Costs
 - Emergency Grant Aid to Students (optional)



ATHLETICS - No Fall Sport Budget Scenario

- 400 student-athletes participating 16 sports
- Revenue is anticipated to drop roughly \$5.9 million
 - The most significant loss of revenue could be for game guarantees —\$3.2 million
- As an offset to the loss of revenue, expenditures savings of \$4.2 million are expected under this scenario
 - This includes travel savings of \$1.3 million and savings in game guarantee expense of roughly \$800,000
- The anticipated budget shortfall is approximately \$1.7 million



Concluding Statements

In Summary,

- We have a strategic plan and it will guide our decisions
- We're prepared for multiple modalities and we will use an optimum mix based on local conditions
- We will actively monitor local conditions at each of our campuses and make decisions based on the best information and guidance for each location
- We cannot guarantee zero infections, but we can provide best practice accommodations. We can and will provide accommodations for the most vulnerable
- Testing and contact tracing are critical (enables much more effective planning and protections)
- We will be strategic in reducing costs and avoid across the board cuts
- We intend to make structural changes based on benchmarking of best practices at peer institutions and performance data relative to each of our functional units
- Enhanced last mile broadband connectivity
