- Core Issues - Historically students struggle with citing textual evidence and writing (Critical Thinking) and in Reading students struggle in comprehension and fluency.
 - Professional Development focus in Writing Tools (writing strategies) and 95% Reading strategies.

Legislative Wish List

Funding

1. We would like money to be provided to the districts to support funding for interventionists to support students' learning during the school day versus additional time after school or during the summer.
2. CTE funding to expand on our programs.
3. More funding for Special Education teachers as an incentive to support their additional work loads.

Programing

1. Dossier process needs to change to a portfolio or superintendent approval for teachers to level up.
2. Simplify the grant application management process for Federal grants at the PED.

Responses to Martinez/Yazzie Findings

Bloomfield historically had many supports in place due to the culture and rural nature of our district. As a Title 1 district for many years, we have always strived for compliance for all subgroup populations.

- ELL support for all students through TESOL endorsed teachers at every grade level through inclusive and pull-out settings.
- Bilingual support K-12 for Spanish and Navajo Language : 4 Navajo Language Teachers
6 Spanish Language Teachers.
- Family / Community resource Liaison : This individual supports all school sites for students who are experiencing homelessness, students with attendance issues, struggling families and low income issues.
- Bloomfield Schools works diligently to keep K-12+/ ELTP learning in place at a flexible level to support students.
- Bloomfield Schools has developed a cultural capacity workshop with embedded Vector training for all teachers to complete in areas of cultural relevance.
- Bloomfield School District works to support teacher recruitment, retention and training by hiring additional staff to support the augmented demand post-covid.

Instructional Process and Measuring Student Achievement

- Developed interim assessment to monitor progress quarterly to make data driven decisions in the classroom.
- Aligned standards Kindergarten - 12th grades in English Language Arts and Math.
- Provided a online state assessment-like tool administered to students to develop test taking skills and stamina to support the student being able to demonstrate their knowledge on assessment.
- Using our Common Interim Assessment data, teachers create Teacher Action Plans to identify students' deficits and create and implement a re-teaching plan to support the students.
- We offer after school tutoring to support students with their deficit skills.
- We provide internet access for remote learning opportunities.
- We continue to provide accelerated learning opportunities by providing grade level skills during core instruction and work on deficit skills during intervention blocks.

Instructional Process and Measuring Student Achievement

- ▶ Offer Advanced Placement and Dual Credit options for students and teachers (Professional Development) to elevate instruction in the classroom.
- ▶ The Alternative High School is a credit recovery program where the students may transfer and participate in accelerated courses to gain back the lost credits and return to the main high school to graduate if they choose to, or graduate with the Alternative High School.
- ▶ Attendance teams to monitor student success.
- ▶ Flexible Extended Learning Time that includes optional STEM Summer school programs in June.
- ▶ One to one technology - PreK-12.
