



What are the goals of dual credit?

To provide high school students the opportunity to

- enroll in rigorous college level academic or career technical courses
- earn credit toward high school graduation and a post-secondary degree or certificate, ultimately reducing students' costs and time to degree completion post high school



How do we ensure high quality, rigorous dual credit?

- Standards for coursework
 - Dual credit courses taught offsite must meet the same standards and learning outcomes as those taught at the college campus
- Assess dual credit program for effectiveness
 - > Student characteristics, high school completion rates, HEIs enrollment, remediation rates, transferability of dual credit courses, and persistence in a degree-granting program



Higher Learning Commission's Faculty Qualifications and Support

- Instructors must have
 - a master's degree in the discipline or subfield in which he/she teaches or
 - a master's degree in any discipline + 18 graduate credit hours in the discipline or subfield in which he/she teaches.
- Instructors must
 - participate in orientation
 - have opportunities to discuss concerns with other faculty
 - have access to mentoring
 - be evaluated by the department in which they teach



Why is it important to align with HLC standards?

- HLC is the accrediting body for all of New Mexico's public HEIs
 - > HLC announced its intention to scrutinize dual credit programs
 - > Rigor
 - > Quality
 - > Faculty qualifications
- Not meeting standards could put HEIs at risk of losing accreditation
 - > Students would be ineligible for federal financial aid
 - Coursework would not transfer to accredited institutions



How do we ensure that dual credit reduces students' cost and time to degree?

- 60 credits for an associates or 120 credits for a bachelors degree, with specific requirements, including:
 - ➤ General Education
 - ➤ University/College
 - ➤ Major
- Credit hours for a certificate vary and requirements are <u>highly</u> focused on a particular field or career
- To take courses that count, students must choose a path
 - ➤ An area of interest (meta-major)
 - ➤ Major (certificate, associates, or bachelors)



How do we ensure that dual credit reduces students' cost and time to degree? (cont'd)

- HED is working with the HEIs to build degree plans and metamajors
 - ➤ Guide students, parents, and advisors toward courses that count
- This will help students reach the goal of graduating from college in less time after high school and saving money

Marketing

- Meta-majors are one semester academic plans that count toward multiple degree programs
 - ➤ Includes aligned mathematics, general education courses, and early degree requirements
 - ➤ Majors will be grouped into metamajors based on an overlap in the first 15 credit hours of current degree requirements



How about students who are interested in CTE?

- Certificate programs are an integrated part of Dual Credit planning
- Students take courses that are appropriate for their intended career pathway



Common Course Numbering (CCN)

- 10,000 syllabi have been reviewed
- 79 academic disciplines have been reviewed
- CCN will appear in Course Catalogs Fall of 2019
- CCN benefits Dual Credit Students by providing articulation and transfer to any state post-secondary institution
