September 2017 Quarterly Update

Ouarterly Status of Outstanding Capital Funds

- As of September 2017, approximately \$677.5 million from all funding sources for 2,058 projects remains outstanding, including \$86.4 million of earmarked fund balances for water (\$33.4 million), colonias (\$26.4 million), and tribal (\$26.7 million) infrastructure projects. Additionally, approximately \$297 million remains outstanding from supplemental severance tax bonds for public schools.
- The quarterly report includes 132 projects reauthorized in the 2017 legislative session, totaling \$39 million, and 13 new tribal and colonias infrastructure fund projects totaling \$10.8 million.
- The report also includes 148 projects totaling \$174.3 million funded by general obligation bonds (GOB) and approved by voters in November 2016. The bonds are typically sold in March or April, but the Board of Finance delayed the issuance until August 2017.
- Since the June 2017 quarterly report, 419 projects closed and approximately \$85.4 million was expended or reverted.
- Severance tax bonds (STB) makes up 58.6 percent of the total unexpended balance, while GOB accounts for 30 percent, and other state funds (OSF) 11.4 percent. Only 0.01 percent is from general fund (GF) appropriations.

• LFC staff tracks all capital appropriations of \$1 million or more, which total nearly \$1.2 billion for 214 projects. The unexpended balances for those projects is \$555.6 million, or 82 percent, of all unexpended funds. Since the June 2017 report, 34 appropriations totaling \$139 million were fully expended.

HIGHLIGHTS OF SELECT PROJECTS

Aging & Long Term Services Department (16A4006)

• Line 12, \$1,041,693 (2010 STB), funding for the Atrisco Community Adult Day Care & Respite Facility was originally appropriated in 2010 and reauthorized in 2014 and again in 2016. No expenditures have been reported to date and there was no reported progress in the last quarter.

Department of Transportation (16A2638)

• Line 84, \$450,000 (2016 state road fund, SRF), for a salt dome for District 3's south urban patrol yard in Bernalillo County, has been placed on hold pending SRF revenue.

Department of Transportation (multiple appropriations)

• Lines 78-79 and 85-88, \$5.5 million, (SRF), agency management determined these projects will not go forward. Staff recommends voiding these authorizations.

General Services Department (09-3720)

• Line 170, \$1,000,000 (2014 GRT), funding for an executive office building in Santa Fe has an unexpended balance of \$345 thousand and has been in design since 2009. The most recent update to the Capital Project Monitoring System (CPMS) was in June 2015. Staff recommends voiding the authorization until justification for use of funds is submitted.

General Services Department / Department of Agriculture (14-2263)

• Line 171, \$2,800,000, for the tissue digester at the New Mexico Scientific Laboratory. The digester was successfully installed and tested in September, and about \$93 thousand was reverted.

Miners' Colfax Medical Center (15-1060, 16A2632, 16A2633, 16A2634)

• Lines 198-201, four projects totaling \$2.1 million (2015 & 2016 Miners' Trust Fund), reporting has been lacking and the agency's acting CEO established a capital project leadership team to plan and monitor the progress of approved projects.

2014 Water Initiative Status (Attachment A)


- \$83.5 million was authorized for 191 water projects statewide in the 2014 capital outlay bill. To date, over 60 percent are either closed or were deauthorized during the 2016 special session due to inactivity (23 projects totaling \$1.7 million). Nine projects closed in the last quarter.
- Nearly \$24 million, or 28.6 percent, remains unexpended. Of the unexpended balance, seven projects totaling \$4.7 million have no expenditures. A \$3.7 million appropriation for the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority's (CRRUA) wastewater treatment system accounts for most of this balance.
 - Only \$25 thousand of two appropriations for CRRUA totaling \$5.45 million has been expended to date. However, construction began in the last quarter and is set to be complete in early 2018.
- The largest appropriation, \$8 million for a wastewater treatment plant in Chama, had progressed slowly; however, the project was completed in the first quarter of FY18.
- Since funds were appropriated, 14 projects totaling \$11.5 million have been reauthorized to change the purpose or extend time.

<u>Authorized but Unissued Status (Attachment B)</u>

- Following the August 2017 bond sale, 10 projects authorized for \$12.1 million remain unissued. The sale included 35 projects totaling \$7.3 million that were removed from the December 2016 authorized but unissued list.
- BOF made a determination to redirect funding for projects if funds were not encumbered or if there were no expenditures within 18 months following issuance of severance tax bonds. This action affected 69 projects totaling \$6.4 million.
- The \$6.4 million will be applied toward the public school capital outlay fund and the tribal and colonias infrastructure projects. It is unknown if redirected projects were delayed due to the capital outlay freeze.

Status of Earmarked Funds (Attachments C, D and E)

• The chart below summarizes, by year, the percent of all unexpended awards from earmarked funds (water project fund, colonias infrastructure fund, and tribal infrastructure fund). The water project fund's 2017 STB distribution was suspended as part of solvency efforts during the special legislative session.



Outlook for 2018 Session

- Higher education institutions and special schools requested \$232.9 million from 2018 GOB funding for capital projects. Libraries requested \$17.5 million and the Aging and Long-Term Services Department requested \$10.7 million for senior centers.
- Staff from LFC and the General Services Department (GSD), Department of Finance and Administration (DFA), and Department of Information Technology heard capital outlay requests from state agencies totaling \$596.9 million, including:
 - \$252.6 million of deferred maintenance, including nearly \$21 million for life and safety issues, at General Services Department properties;
 - \$47.5 million for correctional facilities, including \$18.8 million for HVAC upgrades, \$2.2 million for generator repairs and replacement, \$6.1 million for fire suppression and water systems, \$6.3 million for security upgrades, and \$14 million for facility improvements and expansion;
 - o \$18 million for Aamodt water rights settlement project costs; and
 - o \$27.1 million for school bus replacement.

Note: Data for quarterly and \$1 million or greater reports is derived from CPMS operated and maintained by DFA. Data is updated quarterly by state agencies and local entities responsible for oversight of the projects and includes expenditures, project status, milestones achieved last quarter, and projected milestones. 2014 Water Initiative Status Update First Quarter, Fiscal Year 2018

Nearly \$24 million of 2014 capital outlay appropriations for water storage, delivery, and treatment projects remains unspent; \$5 million was expended in the first quarter of FY18. Water was the primary focus of the 2014 capital outlay bill which funded 191 water projects at a cost \$83.5 million. As of September 2017, \$4.7 million in appropriations had not been drawn down at all, down from \$8.85 million at the end of the third quarter. Funding for Bradner Dam, which received multiple appropriations and is close to being bid for construction, started to move in the first quarter of FY18. Over 60 percent of the projects are closed, including 9 in the last quarter. Included in the closed projects are 14 projects totaling \$11.5 million which have been reauthorized to change the purpose or extend the time to spend the funds beyond the original four year period. These reauthorized appropriations still have a total balance of about \$4.5 million and two of the projects closed in the first quarter. Additionally, funding for 23 projects totaling \$1.7 million was de-authorized during the 2016 special session due to inactivity.

The Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) received \$6.2 million for forest thinning and watershed restoration and has made significant progress in spending the funds by taking a proactive approach and setting up grant agreements and working with other partners before the funds were received. To date, the agency has spent all but \$86 thousand of the appropriation.

Nearly three-quarters of the projects are for local entities and overseen by the Environment Department (NMED). At the July 2016 Legislative Finance Committee meeting in Ruidoso, NMED officials stated much of the slow progress was due to the fact that many of the projects did not have complete plans or designs when the funds were appropriated. Nearly 70 percent of these projects are complete, 7 projects totaling \$4.8 million are inactive, and 17 projects that received \$876 thousand were de-authorized during the special legislative session in 2016.

Eight appropriations greater than \$1 million have closed, including \$1.4 million for water system improvements in Rio Rancho, \$2 million for the first phase of a sanitary sewer system in Carnuel, and \$1.9 million to expand a wastewater treatment facility in Los Lunas. The largest project, \$8 million for a wastewater treatment plant in Chama, had progressed slowly; however, the project was completed in the first quarter. Only \$25 thousand of two appropriations for the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority (CRRUA) totaling \$5.45 million has been expended to date. Construction began in the first quarter and is set to be complete in early 2018.
