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Areas of Responsibility

Field Services: Veteran advocates, assisting veterans and eligible family members with filing federal claims and applying for state benefits.

State Benefits: Manages state veterans' benefits, memorials, and state cemeteries.

Healthcare: Educates veterans about available health benefits and connects veterans to community resources; manages transportation and homeless initiatives.

State Approving Agency (SAA): Reviews, audits, and approves state educational institutions to receive GI Bill[®] education benefits funding.*

Veteran Business Outreach Center (VBOC): Assists veterans, reserve component members, and their eligible spouses with business planning, funding, marketing, and all other assistance needed to start or grow a business.





FY21 Accomplishments

COVID Response: Collaborated with DOH and VAMC on vaccine outreach and messaging.

Highly Rural Transportation Grant (HRTG): NMDVS received its first HRTG in FY21 for 9 counties – Cibola, Colfax, Guadalupe, Harding, Mora, Quay, San Miguel, Socorro, and Union. Completed rides – 144 rides, most of which in the last quarter.*

Women Veteran Program: Hired program coordinator. Successful Women Veterans' Day.

Angel Fire opening: Angel Fire opened in summer 2020. Total number of internments to date – 62.


HRTG Renewed and Expanded:

Nine counties were originally selected for last FY's pilot: Cibola, Colfax, Guadalupe, Harding, Mora, Quay, San Miguel, Socorro, and Union. FY22 Grant now covers all 15 counties designated highly rural areas, adding Catron, De Baca, Hidalgo, Lincoln, Sierra, and Torrance.


Rides for the original nine counties continue; the agency is currently establishing contracts for the additional six counties.
