DHSEM Homeland Security Bureau / Fusion Center Intelligence Sharing Partnerships


Fusion centers are a key element of our homeland security because they build., maintain and improve partnerships at the state, local, and federal levels and help ensure better coordination of vital counterterrorism and threat information. As threats to our state continue to evolve, we must take the necessary steps to mitigate gaps in threat detection, intelligence sharing, reporting and coordinated responses. Through critical local partnerships, the New Mexico All Source Intelligence Center (NMASIC), housed with the DHSEM Homeland Security Bureau, strives to collect and report on criminal intelligence to inform coordination, collaboration, resource mobilization and decision making regarding threats, risks and vulnerabilities in our state.

The Homeland Security Bureau at DHSEM is at present almost entirely funded by grant money from FEMA. The stagnant level of funding for New Mexico – almost unchanged for the past fve years – has resulted in a no-growth status, which is no aligned to the significant increase in partnership engagement and demands for service. The draft budget for staffing for FY2020/21 provides for a significant increase in staffing – recognizing the demands for service and support, but does not provide for the general operating costs, or for the expansion required to adequately provide for the physical workspace and partnership collaboration to make best use of this staffing.

DHSEM has submitted draft legislation to help address these resource gaps, with the hope that through proof-of-concept and growth of the gains made thus far, FEMA will recognize the successful maturation of the bureau and fusion center and provide additional funding.

The NMASIC has evolved from a largely ineffective "pass-through" office to a fully engaged fusion center. The ineffective and costly approaches to intelligence collection and analysis using a "remote" approach have been replaced with effective regional outreach and engagement processes; the next evolution in the maturation of the NMASIC is to refine this partnership arrangement by maintaining the regional outreach and building a co-located coalition of partners to ensure 24/7 access and responsiveness and to collaborate on collection and assessment operations. This co-located fusion center approach is in-line with national best practices within the most successful fusion centers. As an example, the nearest similar center is the El Paso MATRIX; it maintains co-located space for approximately 20 partners, enabling direct and

continuing intelligence collection, sharing and analysis and has helped make the El Paso region a safer community, lowering crime and providing effective support to a wide variety of federal, state, local and private sector partners. In all of the surrounding states co-located approach has proven to be successful and a "force multiplier" to the mandate and effectiveness of fusion centers.






DHSEM Fusion CenterPartnership Working Space

The DHSEM Homeland Security Bureau is also engaged in various working groups and represents the state within the National Fusion Center Association and the National Network of Fusion Centers, and closely collaborates with the US Department of Homeland Security's Intelligence and Analysis Office – including a co-located Intelligence Officer, ensuring direct and continuing engagement with the national intelligence community.

This partnerships list does not include "virtual partnerships" via the various contact/distributions lists for in-state and out-of-state Law Enforcement/Intelligence Community partners, Critical Infrastructure/Key Resources and the School Security Information Network, nor recurring meetings with FBI-Joint Terrorism Task Force (and JTTF Executive Board meetings), the US Attorney's Office Analyst Working Group, the Albuquerque and Las Cruces HIDTA meetings

(and HIDTA Executive Committee meetings), the Spaceport Intelligence and Security meetings and similar routine intelligence/information sharing efforts.

Additionally the Homeland Security Bureau maintains an extensive partnership across the southern border, particularly in those areas adjacent to Mexico. Through a new initiative DHSEM and the Homeland Security Bureau, and our in-house US DHS Intelligence Analysts have supported the piloting and temporary assignment pending recruitment, of a dedicated intelligence analyst from US DHS to the border area. This has resulted in almost a 10-fold increase in intelligence products addressing transnational crime and regional threats.

DHSEM also administers the disbursement of over \$3 million I supplemental funding through Operation Stonegarden; a project that addresses non-immigration border area enforcement of Drug, human and arms trafficking in coordination with US Customs and Border protection/Border patrol. Much of this funding, in goods and services is spent in the border region.

Additionally, both the Albuquerque Police Department Real-Time Crime Center and the Albuquerque Public School Police have expressed interest in partnership and sharing of real-time video feeds to an Albuquerque based fusion center to ensure continuity in situational awareness and responses.
