The unified priority request of all District Attorneys and the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys is a much needed increase to base to the General Fund of the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys due to a significant decrease of revenues from 2018-2022 in the AODA (Fund 11180) which is used for the required District Attorney Training/Continuing Legal Education and costs associated with network bandwidth infrastructure services throughout the State.

Previous to legislative changes made in 2018, funds were collected by District Attorney Offices from Pre-Prosecution Diversion and deposited to Administrative Office of the District Attorneys via the DA Fund. NMSA 31-16A-1 et seq. removed the ability to collect fees, thereby causing an annual deficit/loss of revenue to the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys of nearly \$400,000.00. This loss of revenue significantly impacts all District Attorney Office's abilities to supply statewide network bandwidth, as well as, provide statutory and professionally required continuing legal education training. Enabling the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys to provide network services and continuing education classes is a financial burden that will not be forced upon the individual District Attorneys Offices.

The second unified priority request by the District Attorneys is for expansion of the Administrative Office of the District Attorneys for two (2) full-time permanent employees. The first one of high

priority is an IT Application Developer. This position will assist the Administrative Office of the

District Attorneys in its statutory mission to both update and develop a case management system and work on various data-sharing projects with other criminal justice agencies to increase statewide

efficiency through automation. The second high priority expansion request is for a Special Program

Director. This position is currently a term position in the DA Fund (11180) and needs to be

converted and funded to make it permanent and a general fund position.
