






Uniformed Response to Behavioral Health Calls



- 100% of uniformed officers (P1/C rank) are Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) certified
 - ■This is a 40 hour class with scenarios and professional actors, which is largely community provider taught.
 - In most police departments this class is the only behavioral health training officers can receive, but not at APD...

Uniformed Response to Behavioral Health Calls



- 49% of Field Service Bureau (FSB) are Enhanced Crisis Intervention Team (ECIT) certified
 - This is a voluntary 8 hour class teaching advanced topics in behavioral health response such as certificates for evaluation and individuals threatening suicide from elevated locations.
- 4 APD Full Time Mobile Crisis Teams (MCT)
 - Consist of an APD ECIT officer and an independently licensed clinician responding to behavioral health calls as a team.





Individuals with repeated CIT Encounters with APD Field Services Officers





Mental Health Transport Destinations



95% of CIT Encounters with Individuals Experiencing Homelessness do not lead to Enforcement Action














When force was used, an ECIT officer was on scene 81% of the time






APD Use of Force Data, 42 force events on BH calls where officers physically arrived on scene, compared to certified ECIT list with date of certification








Injuries as a result of force used on Behavioral Health Calls






APD Use of Force Data, Injuries to individuals from force on behavioral health calls (42), multiple injuries could occur during a single force event, other injury = complaint of injury

2019 in the Crisis Intervention Unit



- 1561 hours of instruction provided by CIT Coordinators
- 36 CIT ECHO sessions held
 - 142 officers attended from 32 agencies
- 555 cases assigned to detectives for follow up
- 937 home visits made by clinicians and detectives
- 1811 individuals assisted by COAST
- 2124 referrals from COAST to community services

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
