November 5, 2024: Election Day

November 18<sup>th</sup> – December 2<sup>nd</sup>: Voting System Check (Audit)

**November 26th: State Canvassing Certification** 

Week of December 2<sup>nd</sup>: Automatic Recounts

December 11th: Certificates of Ascertainment Due

December 17<sup>th</sup>: Electoral College Convenes and Casts Votes for President and Vice President

January 6, 2025: Congress Convenes to Count Electoral Votes in Joint Session

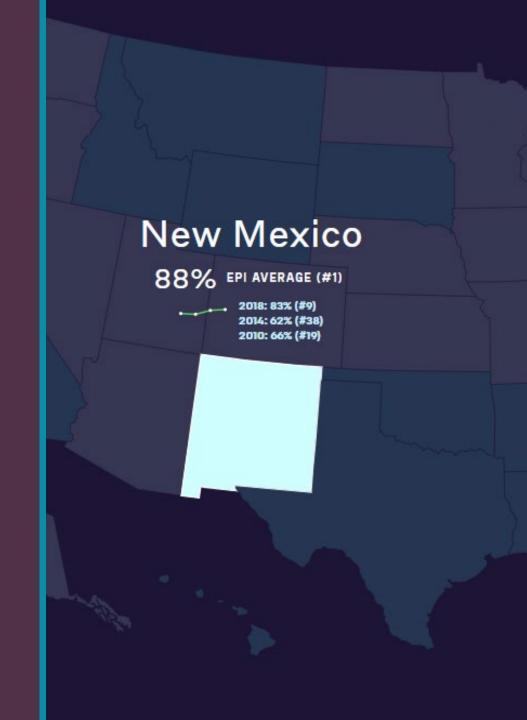

# Number 1 in the Country

#### The Elections Performance Index (EPI)

is a project of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's (MIT) Election Data and Science Lab, which is dedicated to the nonpartisan application of scientific principles to election research and administration.



### MIT EPI Indicators

- 1. the availability of online voter registration
- 2. post-election audits
- 3. web-voter lookup tools
- 4. the return rate of military and overseas ballots
- 5. the percentage of voters who do not register because of registration issues
- 6. the number of provisional ballots
- 7. the number of military ballots rejected
- 8. the office's participation in federal statistical reporting (EAVs)
- 9. voter registration rate
- 10. turnout rate
- 11. mailed ballot rejection rate
- 12. disability access

# New Changes/Initiatives Implementation Update



- SOS Chief Information Security Officer, Permanent Security Program, Federal County Security Grants
- Election Changes (SB 180, 2023)
  - Expansion of voting system check to primary and local elections and to include all counties
  - Election notice prior to each election
  - Online candidate nominating petition signature gathering
  - Poll worker pay increase
  - Challenger/watcher training
  - Recount margin changes

# New Changes/Initiatives Implementation Update



- Voting Rights Protections (HB4, 2023)
  - Permanent Absentee List
  - Drop Box Requirement
  - Native American Voting Rights Act
  - Voting Rights Restoration
  - Automatic Voter Registration (2025)

## New Changes/Initiatives

## Election Fund Grants, Reimbursements and Reporting, NMAC 1.10.36 (2023)

- Created definitions for eligible expenses, election equipment, poll worker pay, ineligible expenses and office supplies
- Established timelines/requirements for memorandums of understanding between the county clerks and the secretary of state's office before and after each election
- Defined reporting requirements

#### Distribution to the Election Fund, SB 108 (2024)

- Created funding source for the Election Fund



# 2025 Legislative Advocacy Priorities

#### Budget

- Elections Funding
- Campaign Finance Information System (CFIS) C2 Request
- Election Management System C2 Request

#### Election Administration Changes

- Eliminating the Municipal Officer Election
- Emergency Election Procedures
- Newly Elected/Appointed Clerk Training Requirements
- Other Small Changes to the Election Code based on Administrative Experience

# 2025 Legislative Advocacy Priorities

#### Campaign Reporting Act

- Federal Court Ruling on Political Party Contributions
  - 1. Found that limits on contributions from state political parties to county political parties are unconstitutional.
  - 2. Found that CRA limits on contributions from state political parties to nongubernatorial and gubernatorial candidates or candidate committees are unconstitutional.
- Administrative Changes/Clarity in Reporting Deadlines
