

We are proud of the investment we have made in this venture for it enhances education, contributes to many worthwhile organizations, and gives us the chance to share the story of modern agriculture.




"A-Maze-in" America





With a focus on Fun and Ag based activities, our Agri-Tourism venture is an autumn weekend destination for families within a 100 mile radius.







Since 1999, we have been inviting our community to our farm, in order to enjoy the outdoors and give parents the chance to re-experience fond farm memories with their children.


the Maze fully operational, we have a staff of over 90 seasonal people; with 6 people working year 'round.


Our staff members are like a part of our family, and even though the jobs are seasonal, we have about an 80% return rate from year to year.
