



Election Activities for the General Election of 2024

The League of Women Voters of New Mexico and the local Leagues in New Mexico will be:

Publishing our online nonpartisan Voter Guide, Vote411, which requires gathering and checking information on polling places, races, and ballot issues. We also ask candidates carefully chosen nonpartisan questions and include their answers.

Printing and distributing Voter Guides in the four local League areas. Printing and distributing the Native American Voter Guide in the twelve counties with a significant Native American population. This was done originally at the request of the Secretary of State's office in 2018. We raise the funds for this and we are proud to announce that this year we will be able to include candidate answers, state and local bond information, and the pros and cons of the constitutional amendments.

Publicize voting information through tabling events, social media and PSAs. This includes voting information, how voting is done, when, where to register and to vote.

Combatting voter suppression and mis-, dis-, and mal-information.

Continuing to work with the Democracy Project to reassure voters that the election system works and their vote counts. The project has developed videos and audio PSAs of county clerks and other election officials urging New Mexicans to vote.

Holding candidate forums where candidates can let voters know where they stand on issues.
