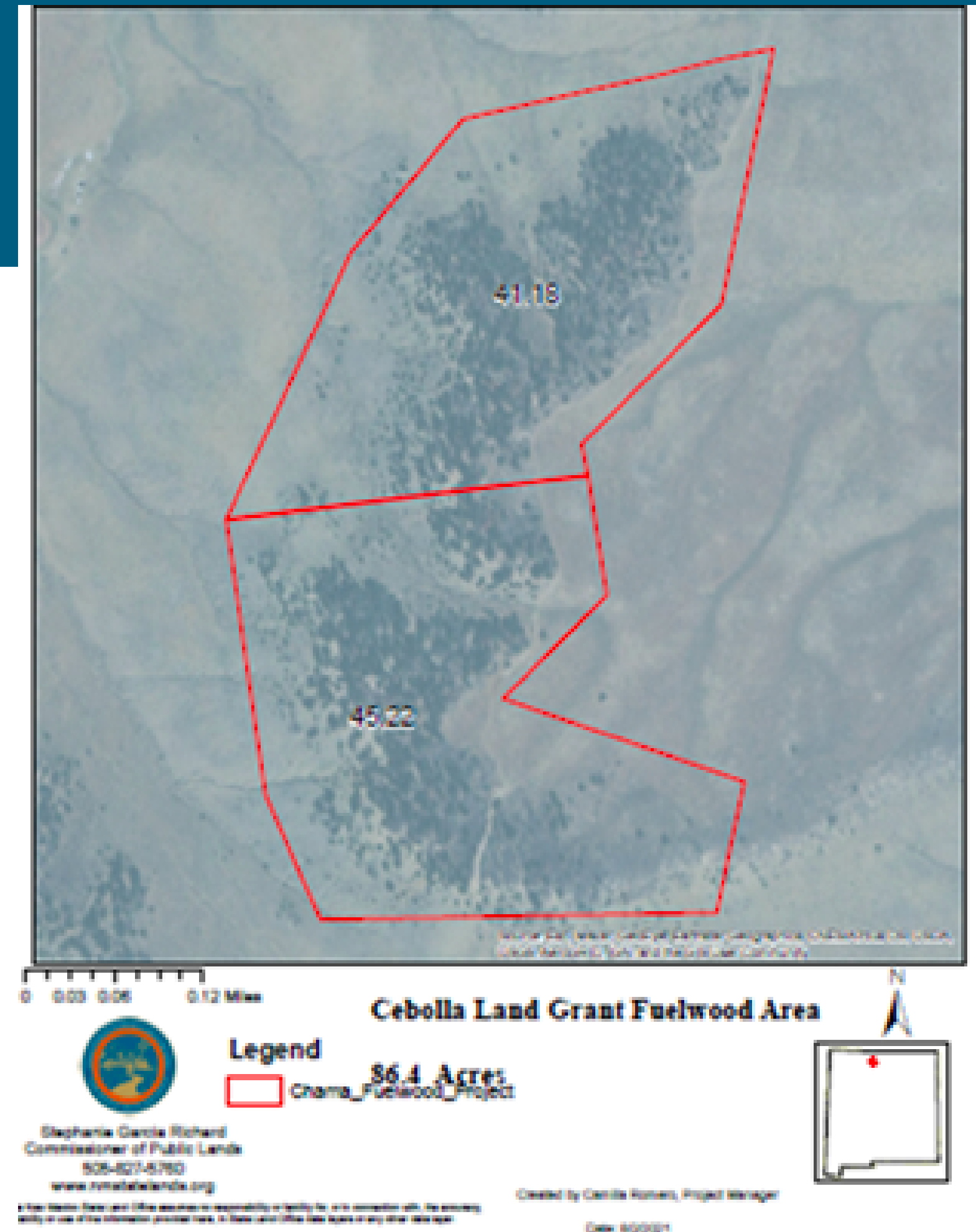

San Joaquin del Rio de Chama Land Grant

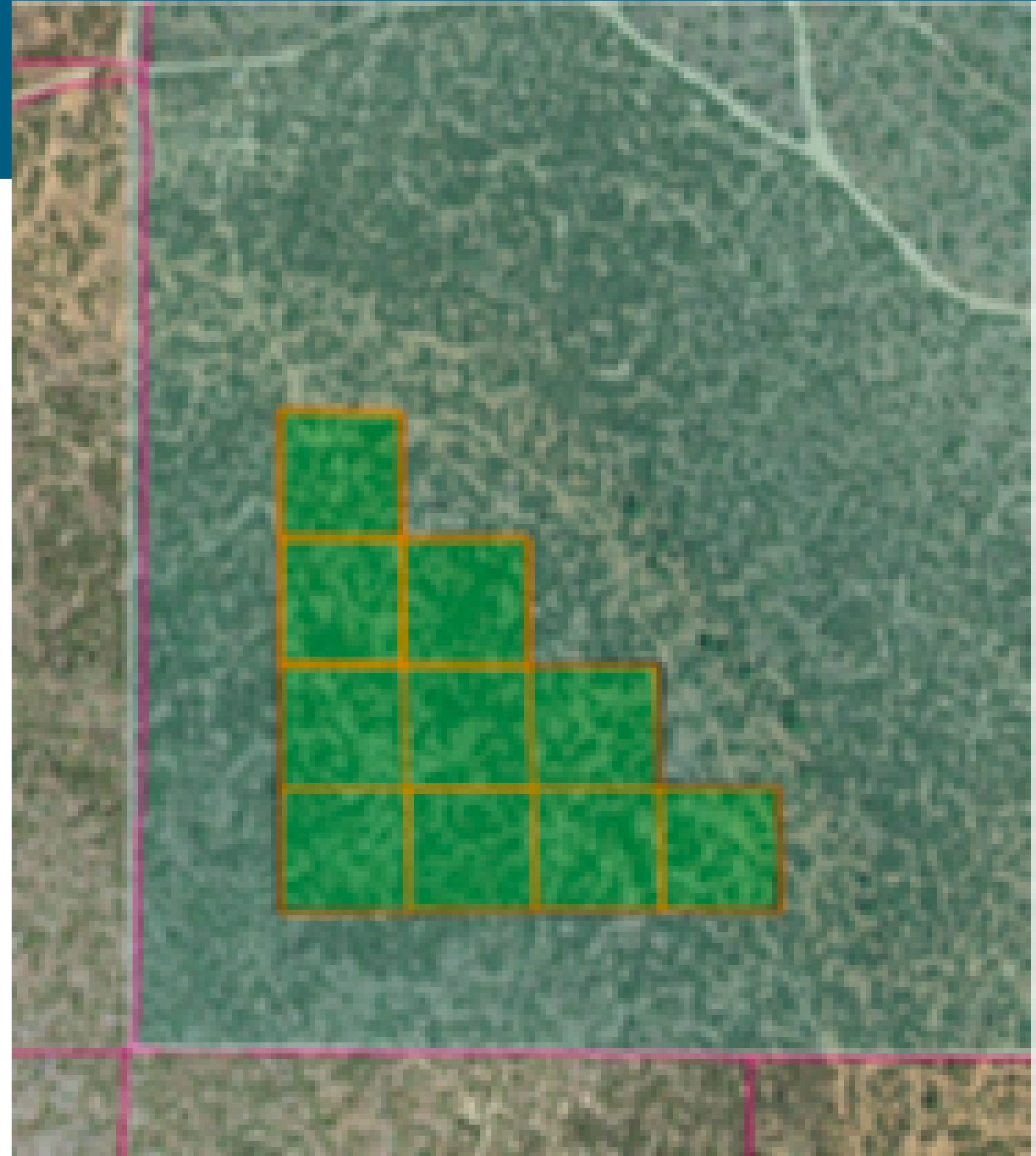
- The project began in 2019 in Cebolla (Rio Arriba County) and is ongoing.
- Partnership with the agriculture lessee's, the San Joaquin del Rio Chama Land Grant, and the Tierra Amarilla Land Grant.
- The fuelwood area is 86 acres and an estimated 2 cords of wood from each acre.
- The project was paid for by the San Joaquin del Rio Chama Land Grant and they will distribute the fuelwood to the heirs of both the Land Grants.





Santa Barbara Land Grant Mayordomo Project

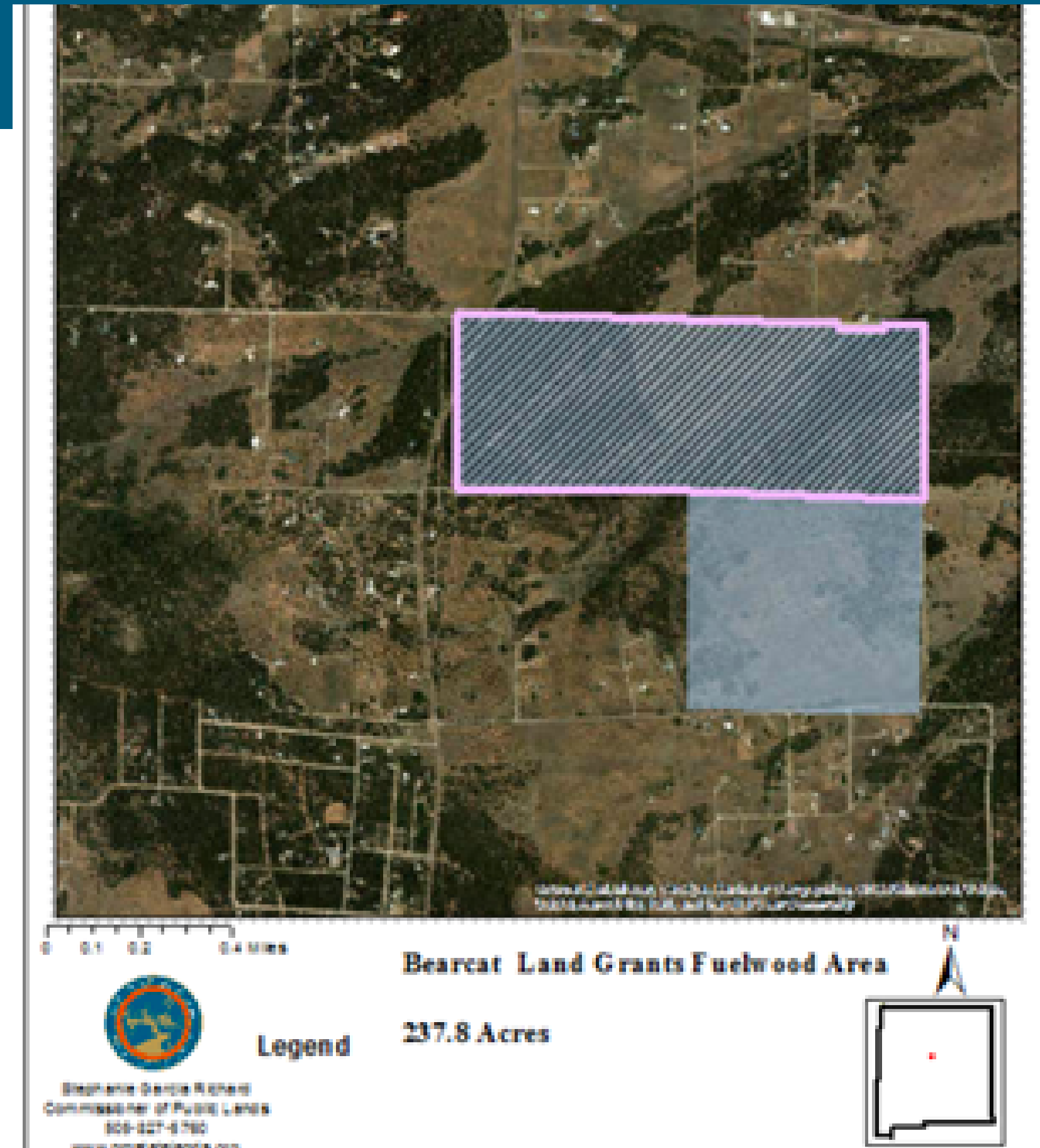
- The project began in 2020 and will provide fuelwood for the Land Grant and local residents impacted by wildfires.
- This project will replicate the forest mayordomo model that was piloted by the Cerro Negro Forest Council and Rio de las Trampas Forest Council.
- Partnership with the agriculture lessee's, Santa Barbara Land Grant, and Taos County.
- The fuelwood area is 10 acres initially with an option to expand into an additional 40 acres.





Carnué, Chilili, Tajique, & Manzano Land Grants Bearcat Project

- This multi-year project is in the planning phase and is slated to begin in Spring 2022.
- Partnership with the agriculture lessee's, Edgewood SWCD, the Land Grant Council, and the Land Grants of Tajique, Conon de Carnue, Torreon, Chilili, and Manzano.
- The SWCD expects to know more in December about funding available to help assist with this 230-acre project.
