- Articles of Incorporation filed with State of New Mexico – December 1, 2014
- Formally launched membership – employer led multi-stakeholder organization on May 1, 2015 after RWJF Aligning Forces for Quality funding ended
- IRS 1023 filing submitted end of June to establish the organization as a formal independent 501c3 (status pending)

 2. Looking to develop an Employer's Guide to Managed Care
 3. Possibly looking to do an employer based survey on health insurance in NM that provide benchmarks here locally for our employers
