#### Veterans Resource Center





- The goal of the center is to provide a location at CNM where Veterans and their dependents can receive personal and academic support while attending CNM.
- The center provides a supportive oncampus environment assisting Veteran students in making a smooth transition to college life and to successfully completing their educational programs.
- The center is a lifeline for all Veterans transitioning from military life and/or war.





### CNM Veterans Resource Center



- 2015 Academic Year 2228 Veterans used the VRC
- 2016 Spring, Summer 2478 Veterans used the VRC (1884 males, 594 females)
- 80% of Veterans utilizing Center are unemployed. (Summer 2016)





# Transition Difficulties

- The survey of 1,845 post-9/11 Veterans found that 22 percent were unemployed, much higher than the numbers typically reported by the Bureau of Labor and Statistics
- 23% of homeless population are Veterans; 33% of male homeless population are veterans; 47% Vietnam Era; 17% post-Vietnam; 15% pre-Vietnam; 67% served three or more years; 33% stationed in war zone
- 76% experience alcohol, drug, or mental health problems
- Female homeless Veterans represent an estimated 3% of homeless Veterans.

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- Assisting with accommodations with CNM's Disability Resource Center

- Assisting with vocational exploration, selecting a suitable major, and career counseling services coordination with the Veteran Administration VetSuccess on-campus counselor
- Obtaining referrals for medical and mental health care



# Services Provided



- Job placement assistance and coordinate with Local Veterans Employment Representatives (LVER) and Disabled Veterans Outreach Programs (DVOP), and CNM's Job Center along with referrals to the CNM Job Lab
- Apply for educational benefits using VONAPP
- Transition support services (Red Carpet treatment for new students)
- Assistance with eBenefits and obtaining premium account
- Volunteer Tutoring and Peer Mentoring services provided by veterans
- Assistance in obtaining Scholarships, (UNM TAOS Veterans Upward Bound, book scholarships, and CNM scholarships, State of New Mexico, Vietnam and Wartime Scholarships.)
- Notary Public Services
- Fax and Copier Services
