

2022-2023 Systems-based Capital Outlay Award Gallup McKinley County Schools - Indian Hills Elementary School

Broadband

2019 and 2022 BDCP Category 1 and Category 2 Awards

Category 1 Award

- Approved to re-authorize the BDCP award to provide the state match for application funding year 2019 for Category 1 to Gallup McKinley District (Tse' Yi' Gai HS)
- Awarded a total of \$187,738 to secure the extra funding match from the E-rate program and upgrade the school connectivity.

Category 2 Awards

- Approved the Broadband Deficiencies Correction Program (BDCP) awards of actual E-rateapproved project amounts to provide the state match for application funding year 2022.
- For Category 2 (Network Equipment) to six school districts/schools for a total of \$222,172.82
- 2022 state matching awards were rescinded for \$965.66 to ACES Technical Charter School and \$1,429.13 to Mountain Mahogany Community School, due to scope non-eligibility. Each allocation is intended to fully complete the project, phase, or specified purpose.

Preliminary Ranking

2023 Preliminary Ranking

- The Preliminary Weighted New Mexico Condition Index (wNMCI) Ranking is released annually prior to the release of the application cycle, and is based on criteria and weightings previously adopted by the Council.
- The ranking lists all of the schools eligible for funding, based on their deficiencies.

Awards Cycle

2022-2023 Systems-based Capital Outlay Award Moriarty – Edgewood ES

- Moriarty-Edgewood School District initially applied for a Systems-based capital outlay program for construction funding to complete site survey, abatement of hazardous materials (if needed), utility disconnection (if needed), demolition of facilities, and final grading/drainage modifications at the abandoned Edgewood ES - South Building and Moriarty HS - East Complex.
- Moriarty-Edgewood School District rescinded their application for Edgewood ES and received an award for Moriarty HS – East Complex.

Awards Cycle

FY23 Lease Assistance Awards

- The Lease Assistance Award were made to 108 charter and district school applicants.
- Total of \$20,573,852
- \$815.60 per MEM (an increase of 7% over last year)

Out-of-Cycle Awards

Albuquerque Sign Language Academy Award Language Change

The Albuquerque Sign Language Academy is ASL-English tuition-free public charter school

- 95% of students have a link to the deaf community, either by being deaf or hard of hearing themselves or by having a deaf sibling, parent, cousin, or other family members.
- 1 to 1 ratio of deaf to hearing students
- 65% of students operate through special education programming
- Construction Phase Total Award: \$28,007,571
 - (Includes additional State match of \$6,718,307)
- Local match of \$3,000,000
- 300 students, grades K-12

Out-of-Cycle Awards

Zuni Combined Campus Design Phase Funding for Campus and Teacher Housing

A Standards-based award was made to Zuni MS, Twin Buttes HS and Zuni HS to consolidate the schools into a single combined campus.

- Campus design phase award \$8,458,907 (100%) for the design phase of the replacement facility.
- State match \$8,458,907
- Local match \$0
- 581 students (grades 7-12)
- Teacher Housing design phase award \$1,060,714 (100% state)
 - 18 teacher housing units
