OSHA Standards – Medical Surveillance Requirements

Standard requirements may include some or all of the following:

- ✓ Pre-placement Exam
- ✓ Periodic Exam
- ✓ Emergency/Exposure Examination and Tests
- ✓ Termination Exam
- ✓ Examination Includes Special Emphasis on Specific Body Systems
- ✓ Work and Medical History
- ✓ Chest X-Ray
- ✓ Pulmonary Function Test (PFT)
- ✓ Other Required Tests
- ✓ Evaluation of Ability to Wear a Respirator
- ✓ Additional Tests if Deemed Necessary
- ✓ Written Medical Opinion
- ✓ Employee Counseling
- ✓ Medical Removal Plan
