[(12)] (10) one representative of the Navajo

Nation who lives in New Mexico appointed by the president of
the Navajo Nation [or the president's designee].

- B. The chair of the board shall be elected by a quorum of the board members. The board shall meet at the call of the chair or whenever three members submit a request in writing to the chair, but not less often than once each calendar year. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of at least a majority of a quorum present shall be necessary for an action to be taken by the board.
- C. Each public member of the board appointed by the [governor] New Mexico legislative council shall be appointed to a four-year term; [To provide for staggered terms two of the initially governor-appointed public members shall be appointed for terms of two years and three members for terms of four years. Thereafter, all governor-appointed members shall be appointed for four-year terms] provided that terms are staggered such that only three terms shall end every two years. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the [governor] New .205093.2

<u>Mexico legislative council</u> for the remainder of the unexpired term.

- D. Public members of the board shall be reimbursed for attending meetings of the board as provided for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.
- E. Public members of the board are appointed public officials of the state while carrying out their duties and activities under the Water Project Finance Act.
- F. A public member of the water trust board serving on July 1, 2017 shall serve the remainder of the term for which the member was appointed. If a vacancy occurs in a governor-appointed public member's position after July 1, 2017, the New Mexico legislative council shall appoint a qualified person to serve in that position for the remainder of the member's term."

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
