FISCAL IMPLICATIONS This bill appropriates \$300.0 in general fund which is a 90.5% increase over the current year budget of \$157.5. AODA has administered these monies for the past three years and presently oversees eight programs funded at \$19.7 each. The agency reported respective decreases in funding from a high of \$200.0 in FY98, to \$175.0 in FY99, to \$157.5 in FY2000. Consequently, it may be difficult to maintain existing safehouses or add new programs without sufficient appropriations. **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS** SB265 poses minimal impact as AODA has been administering the forensic evaluation program for the past three years.
