The CHE will promulgate rules to implement the program. Eligible Native American students will attend the state's public post-secondary institutions or a New Mexico campus or branch created by an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo, or by the federal government. FISCAL IMPLICATIONS The appropriation of \$500.0 contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY01 shall not revert to the general fund. **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS** The CHE notes minimal impact. RELATIONSHIP This bill relates to House Bill 475. **OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES** According to the CHE, resident Native American students are eligible to apply for any of the state funded financial aid programs.
