## **SUMMARY**

### Synopsis of Bill

The memorial requests that the Legislature designate appropriate interim committees to study the organization and performance of the existing NM health care financing and delivery system.

### Significant Issues

The memorial states the health policy of the state is to ensure that all New Mexicans have accessible, available, affordable, culturally appropriate basic health services.

## **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

The Legislative Council Service indicates the cost of convening a 20 member interim committee is approximately \$20.0.

The Health Policy Commission indicates, as a former Robert Wood Johnson grantee, the commission has access to technical assistance and a small amount of funding for state health policy analysis from the RWJ foundation state initiatives grant.

## DUPLICATION

The memorial duplicates SJM48, and relates to HB165, HB169, HJM13 and other bills addressing access, financing and delivery of health care.

## TECHNICAL ISSUES

The Health Policy Commission indicates:

- Page 2, line 3 *funding* should read funded;
- Bill summary states legislative interim *committees*; however, on Page 3, line 12 and Page 4, lines 5, 12 and 16, committee is used.
