HOUSE BILL 16

44TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - 2ND SPECIAL SESSION, 2000

AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING BALANCES; CHANGING THE PURPOSES AND AGENCIES OF CERTAIN SEVERANCE TAX BOND AUTHORIZATIONS; EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIODS; CHANGING CERTAIN GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS; CLARIFYING CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF SEVERANCE TAX BOND PROCEEDS; REVERTING CERTAIN UNEXPENDED BALANCES OF PRIOR SEVERANCE TAX AND GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ISSUANCES AND GENERAL FUND AND OTHER APPROPRIATIONS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax

1 Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the
2 amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The
3 state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale
4 of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
5 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has
6 been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that
7 the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time.
8 The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
9 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
10 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
11 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

12 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
13 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds
14 of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is
15 needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section
16 of this act. If an agency has not certified the need for the
17 issuance of the bonds for a particular project by the end of
18 fiscal year 2002, the authorization for that project is void.

19 C. Before an agency may certify for the issuance
20 of severance tax bonds, the project must be developed
21 sufficiently so that the agency reasonably expects to:

22 (1) incur within six months after the
23 applicable bonds have been issued a substantial binding
24 obligation to a third party to expend at least five percent
25 of the bond proceeds for the project; and

(2) spend at least eighty-five percent of
the bond proceeds within three years after the applicable

1 bonds have been issued.

2 D. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
3 another section of this act, the unexpended balance from the
4 proceeds of severance tax bonds issued for a project shall
5 revert to the severance tax bonding fund as follows:

6 (1) for projects for which severance tax
7 bonds were issued to match federal grants, six months after
8 completion of the project;

9 (2) for projects for which severance tax
10 bonds were issued to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment,
11 educational technology or other equipment or furniture
12 exclusive of a more inclusive construction or renovation
13 project, at the end of the fiscal year following the fiscal
14 year in which the severance tax bonds were issued for the
15 purchase; and

16 (3) for all other projects for which
17 severance tax bonds were issued, within six months of
18 completion of the project, but no later than the end of
19 fiscal year 2005.

20 E. Except for appropriations to the capital
21 program fund, money from severance tax bond proceeds provided
22 pursuant to this act shall not be used to pay indirect
23 project costs.

24 F. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
25 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
accounting principles have been paid.

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1 Section 2. GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUND APPROPRIATIONS--
2 LIMITATIONS--REVERSIONS.--

3 A. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
4 another section of this act, the unexpended balance of an
5 appropriation made in this act from the general fund or other
6 state fund shall revert to the originating fund as follows:

7 (1) for projects for which appropriations
8 were made to match federal grants, six months after
9 completion of the project;

10 (2) for projects for which appropriations
11 were made to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment, educational
12 technology or equipment or furniture that are exclusive of a
13 more inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end
14 of the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the
15 appropriation was made for the purchase; and

16 (3) for all other projects for which
17 appropriations were made, within six months of completion of
18 the project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2005.

19 B. Except for appropriations to the capital
20 program fund, money from appropriations made in this act
21 shall not be used to pay indirect project costs.

22 C. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
23 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
24 and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
25 accounting principles have been paid.

Section 3. REVERSION ON PRIOR-YEAR PROJECTS--ALL
FUNDING SOURCES--LIMITATIONS ON PRIOR-YEAR EXPENDITURES FOR

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1 CERTAIN COSTS.--

2 A. All unexpended balances of severance tax bond
3 proceeds from capital outlay projects authorized by the
4 legislature prior to 1995 shall revert to the severance tax
5 bonding fund by October 31, 2000, unless the certifying
6 agency can demonstrate to the state board of finance that:

7 (1) the project is active and there are
8 valid encumbrances on the appropriation; or

9 (2) the legislature reauthorized the project
10 after July 1, 1995 or extended its life beyond July 1, 2000
11 and the project is active.

12 B. All unexpended balances of general obligation
13 bond proceeds from capital outlay projects authorized by the
14 legislature prior to 1995 shall revert to the debt service
15 fund established by the state treasurer for the purpose of
16 paying the principal and interest on the state's general
17 obligation bonds on October 31, 2000, unless the certifying
18 agency can demonstrate to the state board of finance that the
19 project is active and there are valid encumbrances on the
20 appropriation.

21 C. All unexpended balances remaining from
22 appropriations for capital outlay projects prior to 1995 from
23 the general fund or other state funds shall revert to the
24 originating fund by October 31, 2000, unless the agency to
25 whom the money was appropriated can demonstrate to the
financial control division of the department of finance and
administration that:

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1 (1) the project is active and there are
2 valid encumbrances on the appropriation; or

3 (2) the legislature reappropriated the money
4 for the project after July 1, 1995 or extended the project's
5 life beyond July 1, 2000 and the project is active.

6 D. An appropriation of severance tax bond
7 proceeds, general fund or any other state fund provided prior
8 to 2000 shall not be used to pay indirect project costs;
9 provided, however, that this subsection does not apply to
10 appropriations to the capital program fund or to a prior-year
11 appropriation for which a joint powers agreement or other
12 contract was entered into that expressly provided for the
13 payment of indirect costs.

14 Section 4. AGING PROJECTS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
15 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
16 of this act, upon certification by the state agency on aging
17 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
18 following amounts are appropriated to the state agency on
19 aging for the following purposes:

20 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase 1
21 construction of the senior center annex in Cimarron in Colfax
22 county;

23 B. one hundred three thousand dollars (\$103,000)
24 to renovate the kitchen, replace the roof and update the
25 bathrooms at Hospitality House senior center in Las Cruces in
Dona Ana county;

C. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to plan,

1 design, construct, equip and furnish a senior center in
2 Artesia in Eddy county;

3 D. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to purchase a
4 van for the Deming senior center in Luna county;

5 E. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
6 complete phase 2 of the Twin Lakes senior center in McKinley
7 county;

8 F. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to plan and
9 design a senior center in Iyanbito in McKinley county;

10 G. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to purchase a
11 van for the senior center in Edgewood in Santa Fe county;

12 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
13 purchase kitchen equipment for the senior center in Sierra
14 county; and

15 I. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to
16 re-roof and make improvements to comply with uniform building
17 codes and to meet the requirements of the Americans with
18 Disabilities Act of 1990 at the Magdalena senior center in
19 Socorro county.

20 Section 5. ARMORY PROJECTS--STATE ARMORY BOARD--
21 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
22 of this act, upon certification by the state armory board
23 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, one
24 million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated to the state
25 armory board to renovate, repair or make other capital
improvements to various armories located throughout the
state.

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1 Section 6. CULTURAL AFFAIRS PROJECTS--OFFICE OF
2 CULTURAL AFFAIRS--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the
3 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
4 the office of cultural affairs that the need exists for the
5 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
6 to the office of cultural affairs for the following purposes:

7 A. one million six hundred thousand dollars
8 (\$1,600,000) for exhibits, projection and technical support
9 equipment and expansion of the parking lot at Lodestar
10 astronomy center at the New Mexico museum of natural history
11 and science in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

12 B. one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000)
13 to purchase furnishings and equipment and make site
14 improvements at the New Mexico farm and ranch heritage museum
15 in Dona Ana county; and

16 C. two hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$230,000)
17 for a long-range master plan for state monuments and repairs,
18 renovations and improvements at the Coronado state monument
19 in Bernalillo county.

20 Section 7. STATE ENGINEER PROJECTS--SEVERANCE TAX
21 BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
22 upon certification by the office of the state engineer that
23 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
24 amounts are appropriated to the office of the state engineer
25 for the following purposes:

 A. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
replace surface water measurement devices on the Gila river

1 in Catron county;

2 B. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
3 plan, design, construct and renovate Ute dam in Quay county;
4 and

5 C. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to make
6 improvements to the ditch at Ceica de los Gonzales in San
7 Miguel county.

8 Section 8. ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS--DEPARTMENT OF
9 ENVIRONMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions
10 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
11 department of environment that the need exists for the
12 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
13 to the department of environment for the following purposes:

14 A. one hundred eighty-six thousand five hundred
15 forty-five dollars (\$186,545) to purchase a power mulcher for
16 the east mountain transfer station in Bernalillo county;

17 B. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
18 water system improvements in Milan in Cibola county;

19 C. fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) for water
20 system improvements in Milan in Cibola county;

21 D. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design and
22 construct a new water treatment plant in Springer in Colfax
23 county;

24 E. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to replace
25 water lines in Grady in Curry county;

F. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for
land acquisition and relocation of a well for the Dona Ana

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1 mutual domestic water consumers association in Las Cruces in
2 Dona Ana county;

3 G. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
4 plan, design and construct water system improvements for the
5 La Mesa mutual domestic water consumers association in La
6 Mesa in Dona Ana county;

7 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
8 extend water, sewer and gas lines to the Tierra del Sol
9 housing complex in Hatch in Dona Ana county;

10 I. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
11 improvements and upgrades for the well field and storage tank
12 improvement project in Loving in Eddy county;

13 J. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
14 improve the water distribution lines in Loving in Eddy
15 county;

16 K. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
17 install a new water storage tank, booster station, well and
18 distribution lines for the Malaga mutual domestic water
19 consumers and sewerage works association in Eddy county;

20 L. ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) for
21 wastewater system improvements for Bayard, Santa Clara and
22 Fort Bayard state hospital in Grant county;

23 M. seventy-four thousand one hundred dollars
24 (\$74,100) to construct improvements to the water wells and
25 purchase new pumps in Eunice in Lea county;

N. ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) for water
tank and system improvements and for replacing fire hydrants

1 in Corona in Lincoln county;

2 O. eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000) for an
3 engineering analysis to create a model for wastewater
4 collection and recycling in Gallup in McKinley county;

5 P. two hundred eighty-seven thousand five hundred
6 dollars (\$287,500) for water system improvements, including
7 replacement of lines, drainage improvements and necessary
8 street and sidewalk repairs, in Alamogordo in Otero county;

9 Q. twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000) to
10 construct a wastewater treatment plant in Cloudcroft in Otero
11 county;

12 R. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) to construct a
13 wastewater treatment plant in Cloudcroft in Otero county;

14 S. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
15 continue desalination project planning in the Tularosa basin
16 to establish means of using currently unusable water and
17 constructing a desalination plant in Alamogordo in Otero
18 county;

19 T. thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000) for a
20 sewer study and design plan in Logan in Quay county;

21 U. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to construct
22 and acquire land for phase 2 improvements to the Agua Sana
23 regional water system project in Rio Arriba county;

24 V. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
25 expand and improve the Pecos water system in San Miguel
county;

W. one hundred thirty-six thousand one hundred

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1 fifty dollars (\$136,150) to replace and extend the existing
2 infrastructure and purchase and install shutoff valves, fire
3 hydrants and a water tank for the Canon mutual domestic water
4 association in Sandoval county;

5 X. fifty-four thousand seven hundred dollars
6 (\$54,700) to develop a twenty-year wastewater master plan for
7 the Eldorado area in Santa Fe county;

8 Y. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for a
9 regional water system feasibility study for La Puebla,
10 Cuartelez and El Valle de Arroyo Seco in Santa Fe county;

11 Z. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
12 phase 1 wastewater improvements in El Valle de los Ranchos
13 water and sanitation district in Taos county;

14 AA. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to engineer,
15 extend sewer lines, install a lift station and upgrade the
16 existing treatment plant in Estancia in Torrance county; and

17 BB. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
18 and install grinder pumps to the wastewater system in Bosque
19 Farms in Valencia county.

20 Section 9. STATE FAIR PROJECTS--STATE FAIR COMMISSION--
21 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
22 of this act, upon certification by the state fair commission
23 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
24 following amounts are appropriated to the state fair
25 commission for the following purposes at the state fair in
Bernalillo county:

A. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to

1 renovate or replace horse stalls, including associated site
2 and infrastructure improvements;

3 B. seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) for
4 facility and infrastructure improvements throughout the
5 fairgrounds; and

6 C. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to renovate,
7 furnish and equip the African American village.

8 Section 10. GAME AND FISH PROJECTS--DEPARTMENT OF GAME
9 AND FISH--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--GAME PROTECTION FUND.--

10 A. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this
11 act, upon certification by the department of game and fish
12 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, five
13 hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated to the
14 department of game and fish to correct the problem of
15 accumulated sediment at Bear Canyon lake in Grant county.

16 B. The following amounts are appropriated from the
17 game protection fund to the department of game and fish for
18 expenditure in fiscal years 2000 through 2005 for the
19 following purposes, and the unexpended balance shall revert
20 to the game protection fund:

21 (1) nine hundred twenty-five thousand
22 dollars (\$925,000) to furnish, equip and complete the
23 headquarters building in Santa Fe county; and

24 (2) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
25 to correct the problem of accumulated sediment at Bear Canyon
lake in Grant county.

Section 11. HIGHWAY PROJECTS--STATE HIGHWAY AND

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1 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to
2 the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification
3 by the state highway and transportation department that the
4 need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
5 amounts are appropriated to the state highway and
6 transportation department for the following purposes:

7 A. sixty-six thousand four hundred seventy-five
8 dollars (\$66,475) for paving Signal road in Bernalillo
9 county;

10 B. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for asphalt
11 overlay and speed barriers on Mora road southwest and asphalt
12 overlay only on Myrtle road southwest in the Armijo area of
13 the south valley in Bernalillo county;

14 C. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to plan, design
15 and construct improvements, including environmentally
16 designed speed reduction barriers, on Riverside drive
17 southwest and Hardy road southwest in the south valley area
18 of Bernalillo county;

19 D. eighty-eight thousand dollars (\$88,000) to
20 plan, design, acquire rights of way, construct and improve
21 drainage to Mae avenue southwest in the Atrisco area of the
22 south valley, including sections of this street both inside
23 and outside Albuquerque, in Bernalillo county;

24 E. thirty-one thousand dollars (\$31,000) for the
25 planning, acquisition, design and construction of paving
improvements, including environmentally designed speed
reduction barriers, to Gallegos road in the south valley area

1 of Bernalillo county;

2 F. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
3 construct an extension of La Paz road between Paradise
4 boulevard and Chaparral in Bernalillo county;

5 G. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for speed bumps
6 on Greene northwest between Golf Course road and Irving
7 boulevard in Bernalillo county;

8 H. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to plan, design
9 and construct an extension to Learning road, including
10 bicycle trails and landscaping, beginning at the intersection
11 with Coors boulevard and east along Learning road and related
12 areas in the north valley of Albuquerque in Bernalillo
13 county;

14 I. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to plan,
15 design and construct an extension to Learning road, including
16 bicycle trails and landscaping, beginning at the intersection
17 with Coors boulevard and east along Learning road and related
18 areas in the north valley of Albuquerque in Bernalillo
19 county;

20 J. thirty-eight thousand six hundred fifty dollars
21 (\$38,650) to plan, design and construct an extension to
22 Learning road, including bicycle trails and landscaping,
23 beginning at the intersection with Coors boulevard and east
24 along Learning road and related areas in the north valley of
25 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

K. nine thousand nine hundred ten dollars (\$9,910)
to plan, design, acquire rights of way and construct

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1 improvements to Sol de Sandia place in the south valley area
2 of Bernalillo county;

3 L. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) for speed
4 bumps on roads in house district 17 in Albuquerque in
5 Bernalillo county;

6 M. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) for
7 landscaping along Griegos road from interstate 25 to Twelfth
8 street in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

9 N. one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000)
10 for street improvements on Ninety-eighth street southwest
11 between Central avenue and Sage road in Albuquerque in
12 Bernalillo county;

13 O. one hundred fifteen thousand one hundred
14 seventy-nine dollars (\$115,179) to improve Hughes road,
15 Barbara Vista road, Los Pinos road, Elder/Payne road, Durand
16 road and Lizard lane in the south valley of Bernalillo
17 county;

18 P. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to
19 improve Gun Club road from Isleta boulevard west of Coors
20 road in Bernalillo county;

21 Q. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to maintain
22 roads in Los Ranchos de Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

23 R. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to widen the
24 sidewalk on Copper avenue northeast between Pennsylvania
25 street and Wyoming boulevard in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
county;

S. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to acquire

1 rights of way and plan, design and construct Siempre Verde
2 road in Bernalillo county;

3 T. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
4 southeast and southwest quadrant road projects in Dexter in
5 Chaves county;

6 U. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
7 construct west College avenue between Montana avenue and
8 Sycamore avenue in Roswell in Chaves county;

9 V. one hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$160,000)
10 to widen and make street improvements to west Twenty-first
11 street in Clovis in Curry county;

12 W. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
13 widen west Twenty-first street in Clovis in Curry county;

14 X. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)
15 to widen and make street improvements in Clovis in Curry
16 county;

17 Y. one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) for
18 drainage and road improvements to Brady avenue in Clovis in
19 Curry county;

20 Z. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) for drainage
21 and road improvements on Brady avenue in Clovis in Curry
22 county;

23 AA. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to install
24 signal lights for the La Union elementary school crossing in
25 the Gadsden independent school district in Dona Ana county;

BB. thirty-six thousand three hundred twenty
dollars (\$36,320) to install signal lights for the La Union

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1 elementary school crossing in the Gadsden independent school
2 district in Dona Ana county;

3 CC. fifty-one thousand seven hundred fifty dollars
4 (\$51,750) for reconstruction to the intersection of Triviz
5 drive and University avenue in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

6 DD. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to surface
7 and improve El Centro drive on east mesa in Dona Ana county;

8 EE. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to surface
9 and improve roads in the Las Alturas area, including Tamarisk
10 and Tesota drives, in Dona Ana county;

11 FF. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
12 improve the Mesilla lateral at Myles road in Dona Ana county;

13 GG. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for
14 purchase and installation of pedestrian-scale streetlights at
15 various downtown city streets in Silver City in Grant county;

25 plan, design and construct the expansion of Golf Course road

LL. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)

1 to construct improvements to Golf Course road in Rio Rancho

3 MM. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for
4 improvements to county road 532 in Regina in Sandoval county;

5 NN. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to continue
6 construction of Pipeline road in Sandoval county;

7 OO. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
8 (\$125,000) to continue improving Loma Larga road in Corrales

10 PP. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for paving
11 improvements to county road 55 in Santa Fe county;

12 QQ. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
13 plan, design and construct a concrete river crossing where
14 the river intersects with county road 89B in Cuyamungue in
15 Santa Fe county;

16 RR. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
17 plan, design and construct a concrete river crossing where

12 PURPOSE TO SANTA FE COUNTY DWI PROGRAM CENTER--EXTEND
13 EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The severance tax bond proceeds
14 appropriated to the local government division pursuant to
15 Subsection KKK of Section 9 of Chapter 7 of Laws 1998 and
16 amended by Laws 1999 (1st S.S.), Chapter 2, Section 91 to
17 plan, design, construct or equip a detoxification center to
18 be built near the law enforcement complex in Santa Fe county
19 shall not be expended for either purpose but are reauthorized
20 and appropriated to plan, design, construct or equip a DWI
21 program center to be built in Santa Fe county. The period of

 23 Subsection A of Section 23 of Chapter 14 of Laws 1996 to the
 24 New Mexico office of Indian affairs for designing,
 25 constructing and equipping a court building for the Navajo
 nation in Alamo in Socorro county may be expended shall be
 extended through fiscal year 2004. Any unexpended or

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1 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2004
2 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

3 Section 80. MAGDALENA HEALTH CLINIC--EXPAND PURPOSE.--

15 pursuant to Laws 1995, Chapter 218, Section 16 to improve
16 solid waste management and disposal in Socorro county may be
17 expended shall be extended through fiscal year 2002. Any
18 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
19 fiscal year 2002 shall revert to the severance tax bonding
20 fund.

21 Section 82. SOCORRO COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT--
22 GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION--EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The
23 period of time in which the general fund appropriation to the

11 the original purpose but are appropriated to purchase and
12 equip a modular building to be used as an animal shelter in
13 Socorro county.

14 Section 84. LA JOYA ACEQUIA IMPROVEMENTS--CHANGE AGENCY
15 AND PURPOSE FOR LA JOYA COMMUNITY CENTER AND LIBRARY.--The
16 severance tax bond proceeds appropriated to the office of the
17 state engineer pursuant to Subsection E of Section 9 of
18 Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st S.S.) for improvements to the La
19 Joya acequia in Socorro county shall not be expended for the
20 original purpose but are reauthorized and appropriated to the
21 local government division to construct and make improvements
22 to the La Joya community center and library in Socorro
23 county.

24 Section 85. PECOS RIVER BASIN WATER RIGHTS AND PECOS
25 RIVER COMPACT--EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The period of time
in which the New Mexico irrigation works construction fund
appropriations made pursuant to Laws 1998, Chapter 81,

2 basin; Section 3 for the purchase of water rights along the
3 Pecos river basin as amended in Laws 1999 (1st S.S.), Chapter

6 Compact and other matters may be expended shall be extended
7 through fiscal year 2002. Any unexpended or unencumbered

11 EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The proceeds from the sale of
12 severance tax bonds appropriated to the state highway and

15 94B in Santa Fe county may also be expended to improve county
16 road 94 in Santa Fe county. The period of time in which this
17 appropriation may be expended shall be extended through
18 fiscal year 2004. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance

20 severance tax bonding fund.

21 Section 87. SAN JUAN COLLEGE COMPUTER SCIENCE BUILDING--

23 thousand dollars (\$500,000) of the proceeds from the sale of
24 severance tax bonds appropriated to the governing board of

 7 general fund appropriations to the state highway and
 8 transportation department pursuant to Subsections E and P of
 9 Section 34 of Chapter 4 of Laws 1996 (1st S.S.) to design or
 10 construct a new road connecting Hamilton road and United
 11 States highway 54/70 or to install a railroad crossing on the
 12 new road in Otero county shall not be used for those purposes

 20 EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The proceeds from the sale of severance
 21 tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian
 22 affairs pursuant to Subsection B of Section 12 of Chapter 222
 23 of Laws 1995 to plan, design or construct a modular court
 24 building in Alamo in Socorro county and amended in Section 43
 25 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 shall not be expended for its
 original purpose but are reauthorized and appropriated to
 plan, design, construct, purchase, install, equip, furnish or

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1 landscape a building for court purposes in Alamo in Socorro
2 county. The period in which the appropriation may be
3 expended is extended through fiscal year 2004. Any
4 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
5 fiscal year 2004 shall revert to the severance tax bonding
6 fund.

7 Section 90. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
8 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
9 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
10 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
11 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be
12 made for purposes other than those specified in the
13 appropriation.

14 Section 91. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
15 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
16 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
17 public places fund.

18 Section 92. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
19 peace, health and safety that this act take effect
20 immediately.
