HOUSE BILL 155

45TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 2001

AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING BALANCES; CHANGING THE
PURPOSES AND AGENCIES OF SEVERANCE TAX BOND APPROPRIATIONS;
EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIODS; CHANGING GENERAL FUND
APPROPRIATIONS; CLARIFYING CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF
BONDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF
SEVERANCE TAX BOND PROCEEDS; REVERTING CERTAIN UNEXPENDED
BALANCES OF PRIOR SEVERANCE TAX AND GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND
ISSUANCES AND GENERAL FUND AND OTHER APPROPRIATIONS; MAKING
APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell

1 severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax
2 Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the
3 amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The
4 state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of
5 the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
6 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been
7 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the
8 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
9 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
10 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
11 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
12 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

13 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
14 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
15 the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed
16 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
17 act. If an agency has not certified the need for the issuance
18 of the bonds for a particular project, including projects that
19 have been reauthorized, by the end of fiscal year 2003, the
20 authorization for that project is void.

21 C. Before an agency may certify for the issuance
22 of severance tax bonds, the project must be developed
23 sufficiently so that the agency reasonably expects to:

24 (1) incur within six months after the
25 applicable bonds have been issued a substantial binding

1 obligation to a third party to expend at least five percent of
2 the bond proceeds for the project; and

3 (2) spend at least eighty-five percent of the
4 bond proceeds within three years after the applicable bonds
5 have been issued.

6 D. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
7 another section of this act, the unexpended balance from the
8 proceeds of severance tax bonds issued for a project,
9 including projects that have been reauthorized, shall revert
10 to the severance tax bonding fund as follows:

11 (1) for projects for which severance tax
12 bonds were issued to match federal grants, six months after
13 completion of the project;

14 (2) for projects for which severance tax
15 bonds were issued to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment,
16 educational technology or other equipment or furniture that
17 are not related to a more inclusive construction or renovation
18 project, at the end of the fiscal year following the fiscal
19 year in which the severance tax bonds were issued for the
20 purchase; and

21 (3) for all other projects for which
22 severance tax bonds were issued, within six months of
23 completion of the project, but no later than the end of fiscal
24 year 2006.

25 E. Except for appropriations to the capital

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1 program fund, money from severance tax bond proceeds provided
2 pursuant to this act shall not be used to pay indirect project
3 costs.

4 F. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
5 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
6 and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
7 accounting principles have been paid.

8 Section 2. GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUND APPROPRIATIONS--
9 LIMITATIONS-- REVERSIONS. --

10 A. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
11 another section of this act, the unexpended balance of an
12 appropriation made in this act from the general fund or other
13 state fund, including changes to prior appropriations, shall
14 revert to the originating fund as follows:

15 (1) for projects for which appropriations
16 were made to match federal grants, six months after completion
17 of the project;

18 (2) for projects for which appropriations
19 were made to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment, educational
20 technology or equipment or furniture that are not related to a
21 more inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end
22 of the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the
23 appropriation was made for the purchase; and

24 (3) for all other projects for which
25 appropriations were made, within six months of completion of

1 the project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2006.

2 B. Except for appropriations to the capital
3 program fund, money from appropriations made in this act shall
4 not be used to pay indirect project costs.

5 C. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
6 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
7 and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
8 accounting principles have been paid.

9 Section 3. REVERSION ON PRIOR-YEAR PROJECTS--ALL FUNDING
10 SOURCES--LIMITATIONS ON PRIOR-YEAR EXPENDITURES FOR CERTAIN
11 COSTS. --

12 A. All unexpended balances of severance tax bond
13 proceeds from capital outlay projects authorized by the
14 legislature prior to 1995 shall revert to the severance tax
15 bonding fund by October 31, 2001, unless the certifying agency
16 can demonstrate to the state board of finance that:

17 (1) the project is active and there are valid
18 encumbrances on the appropriation; or

19 (2) the legislature reauthorized the project
20 after July 1, 1995 or extended its life beyond July 1, 2001
21 and the project is active.

22 B. All unexpended balances of general obligation
23 bond proceeds from capital outlay projects authorized by the
24 legislature prior to 1995 shall revert to the debt service
25 fund established by the state treasurer for the purpose of

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1 paying the principal and interest on the state's general
2 obligation bonds on October 31, 2001, unless the certifying
3 agency can demonstrate to the state board of finance that the
4 project is active and there are valid encumbrances on the
5 appropriation.

6 C. All unexpended balances remaining from
7 appropriations for capital outlay projects prior to 1995 from
8 the general fund or other state funds shall revert to the
9 originating fund by October 31, 2001, unless the agency to
10 whom the money was appropriated can demonstrate to the
11 financial control division of the department of finance and
12 administration that:

13 (1) the project is active and there are valid
14 encumbrances on the appropriation; or

15 (2) the legislature reappropriated the money
16 for the project after July 1, 1995 or extended the project's
17 life beyond July 1, 2001 and the project is active.

18 Section 4. AGING PROJECTS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
19 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
20 of this act, upon certification by the state agency on aging
21 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
22 following amounts are appropriated to the state agency on
23 aging for the following purposes:

24 A. thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000) to purchase
25 tables, chairs and a sound system for the Los Volcanes senior

1 center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

2 B. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
3 purchase a van for the North Valley senior center in
4 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

5 C. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to renovate the
6 North Valley senior facility in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
7 county;

8 D. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to make
9 capital improvements, including fencing and parking lot
10 paving, to the Lake Arthur senior center in Chaves county;

11 E. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to acquire
12 property for, plan, design, remodel, equip and furnish the
13 Colfax county senior center in Colfax county;

14 F. twenty-four thousand dollars (\$24,000) to plan,
15 design and construct a senior center in Artesia in Eddy
16 county;

17 G. forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to
18 purchase a sixteen-passenger bus for the senior center at
19 Casamero chapter in McKinley county;

20 H. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to purchase a
21 van for the senior citizen program at the Mariano Lake chapter
22 in McKinley county;

23 I. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to expand and
24 equip the kitchen facility of the Espanola senior center in
25 Espanola in Rio Arriba county;

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1 J. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to plan,
2 design and develop an adult daycare center in San Juan county;

3 K. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
4 expand and renovate the senior center in the pueblo of San
5 Felipe in Sandoval county;

6 L. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
7 renovate and expand the senior center in Placitas in Sandoval
8 county;

9 M. two hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
10 (\$275,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a senior
11 center for the Glorieta-Eldorado area of Santa Fe county;

12 N. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to construct,
13 equip and furnish a new senior center facility in Magdalena in
14 Socorro county;

15 O. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for
16 improvements to the senior citizen building in Questa in Taos
17 county;

18 P. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to construct
19 and equip the new senior center in Estancia in Torrance
20 county; and

21 Q. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
22 renovate the senior center in Mountainair in Torrance county.

23 Section 5. CAPITAL PROGRAM FUND-- STATE BUILDINGS--
24 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
25 of this act, upon certification by the property control

1 division of the general services department that the need
2 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts
3 are appropriated to the capital program fund for the following
4 purposes:

5 A. three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to plan,
6 design, renovate and make improvements to the Villagra
7 building in Santa Fe county;

8 B. four million six hundred seventy-three thousand
9 six hundred sixty-six dollars (\$4,673,666) to construct,
10 furnish and equip phase 2 expansion of the law enforcement
11 academy in Santa Fe county;

12 C. seven million dollars (\$7,000,000) to plan,
13 design, construct, furnish and equip a mental health treatment
14 center at the central New Mexico correctional facility in
15 Valencia county; and

16 D. six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) to
17 construct, furnish and equip the Gallup state police station
18 in Gallup in McKinley county.

19 Section 6. COURT PROJECT--NINTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT
20 COURT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
21 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the ninth
22 judicial district court that the need exists for the issuance
23 of the bonds, eighteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$18,500)
24 is appropriated to the ninth judicial district court to
25 purchase a vehicle for the ninth judicial district court in

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1 Curry and Roosevelt counties.

2 Section 7. HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROJECTS-- OFFICE OF
3 CULTURAL AFFAIRS-- SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.-- Pursuant to the
4 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
5 historic preservation division of the office of cultural
6 affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
7 the following amounts are appropriated to the historic
8 preservation division of the office of cultural affairs for
9 the following purposes:

10 A. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
11 preservation and renovation of the McKinley county courthouse;
12 and

13 B. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to restore
14 the roof and make related improvements to the historic Jarales
15 school building in Valencia county.

16 Section 8. MUSEUM PROJECT-- OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS--
17 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.-- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
18 of this act, upon certification by the office of cultural
19 affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
20 six million nine hundred fifty-three thousand dollars
21 (\$6,953,000) is appropriated to the office of cultural affairs
22 to plan, design, construct, equip and furnish a new annex to
23 the palace of the governors in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county.

24 Section 9. CUMBRES AND TOLTEC PROJECTS-- CUMBRES AND
25 TOLTEC SCENIC RAILROAD COMMISSION.-- Pursuant to the provisions

1 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the Cumbres
2 and Toltec scenic railroad commission that the need exists for
3 the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
4 appropriated to the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad
5 commission for the following purposes:

6 A. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) for upgrading
7 the electrical and heating systems in the car shop for the
8 Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission in Rio Arriba
9 county, contingent upon an equal match of appropriations and
10 grants from the state of Colorado;

11 B. two hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$280,000)
12 for locomotive boiler work for the Cumbres and Toltec scenic
13 railroad commission in Rio Arriba county, contingent upon an
14 equal match of appropriations and grants from the state of
15 Colorado; and

16 C. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for
17 track upgrades for the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad
18 commission in Rio Arriba county, contingent upon an equal
19 match of appropriations and grants from the state of Colorado.

20 Section 10. STATE PARKS PROJECT--ENERGY, MINERALS AND
21 NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant
22 to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification
23 by the state parks division of the energy, minerals and
24 natural resources department that the need exists for the
25 issuance of the bonds, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is

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1 appropriated to the state parks division of the energy,
2 minerals and natural resources department for a commemorative
3 memorial for the famous Buffalo Soldier Warm Springs Apache
4 battle at Rockhound Spring Canyon state parks in Luna county.

5 Section 11. STATE ENGINEER PROJECTS--OFFICE OF THE STATE
6 ENGINEER--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
7 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of the
8 state engineer that the need exists for the issuance of the
9 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the office of
10 the state engineer for the following purposes:

11 A. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to replace
12 dilapidated culverts, repair and replace head gates on the
13 main ditch-serving laterals and correct erosion and flood
14 control at major arroyos in the acequia de la Canada Ancha
15 area in Santa Fe and Rio Arriba counties;

16 B. four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to purchase and
17 install steel gates along the Beckham lateral of the Arenal
18 ditch within the middle Rio Grande conservancy district
19 between San Ignacio road and Neat lane in the south valley
20 area of Bernalillo county;

21 C. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for improvements
22 to the acequia in Chamita in Rio Arriba county;

23 D. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for ditch
24 improvements to the Los Trigos ditch association in La Puebla
25 in San Miguel county;

1 E. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for acequia
2 improvements for the El Pueblo acequia association in San
3 Miguel county;

4 F. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
5 (\$125,000) for the installation of pipeline to open ditches,
6 sediment removal and spillway and head wall repair for the
7 Ponderosa ditch association in Sandoval county;

8 G. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for culvert
9 repairs, replacement of head gates on the main ditch, erosion
10 control and other related improvements to the Chimayo district
11 ditch association irrigation area in Santa Fe county; and

12 H. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for
13 improvements and inlet and pipeline extensions to the Cuchillo
14 Valley water users acequia association water system in Sierra
15 county.

16 Section 12. ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS--DEPARTMENT OF
17 ENVIRONMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions
18 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department
19 of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the
20 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
21 department of environment for the following purposes:

22 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to complete
23 phase 3 of the water system improvements project in Tijeras in
24 Bernalillo county;

25 B. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to make

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1 capital improvements, including repairing and replacing of
2 water lines, for the Cumberland cooperative water users
3 association in Chaves county;

4 C. thirty-two thousand dollars (\$32,000) to
5 engineer the replacement of the water tank in Dexter in Chaves
6 county;

7 D. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to extend the
8 distribution lines to loop the water system to the northern
9 area of Mesilla in Dona Ana county;

10 E. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
11 acquire rights of way, engineer, survey and construct
12 improvements to the Dona Ana mutual domestic water consumers
13 association water system in Dona Ana county;

14 F. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to drill and
15 complete a new water well and construct a well house, booster
16 station, water tank and distribution lines to the Malaga
17 mutual domestic water consumers and sewer works association in
18 Eddy county;

19 G. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to construct
20 and implement phase 3 of the wastewater effluent reuse project
21 in Carlsbad in Eddy county;

22 H. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to improve the
23 community water system, including replacement of distribution
24 lines and construction of a new water storage tank, in Loving
25 in Eddy county;

1 I. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase 1
2 capital improvements, including a new well and engineering,
3 for the Cottonwood water cooperative in Eddy county;

4 J. forty-nine thousand dollars (\$49,000) to
5 upgrade the wastewater treatment plant in Artesia in Eddy
6 county;

7 K. nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000) to design
8 and construct phase 3 of the wastewater effluent reuse project
9 in Carlsbad in Eddy county;

10 L. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for water and
11 wastewater system improvements for the La Luz mutual domestic
12 water consumers association in Vaughn in Otero county;

13 M. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
14 (\$125,000) to provide a new water well near the Del Norte pump
15 station and a booster pump system at the Harden overhead tower
16 for fire flow and peak water demand requirements in Hobbs in
17 Lea county, contingent on a fifty percent match from the city;

18 N. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to plan
19 and develop a ground water storage and recovery project for
20 the water users' association in Lea county;

21 O. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for water
22 system improvements, including engineering services and
23 purchase and installation of a water tank, in Corona in
24 Lincoln county;

25 P. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to complete

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1 an engineering study and environmental assessment of the
2 wastewater treatment system in the pueblo of Zuni in McKinley
3 county;

4 Q. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to equip
5 the northwest New Mexico regional solid waste authority in
6 McKinley county;

7 R. three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) to
8 plan, design, engineer and construct improvements, including a
9 hydraulic expansion, to the wastewater treatment plant in
10 Gallup in McKinley county;

11 S. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to construct
12 an additional storage tank and booster station and make
13 related improvements in the Gameraco water and sanitation
14 district in McKinley county;

15 T. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) for equipment
16 for the northwest New Mexico regional solid waste authority in
17 McKinley county;

18 U. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to equip the
19 northwest New Mexico regional solid waste authority in
20 McKinley county;

21 V. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for
22 phase 1 of the sewer system project in Corrales in Sandoval
23 and Bernalillo counties;

24 W. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for water and
25 sewer system improvements in Tucumcari in Quay county;

1 X. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to upgrade the
2 water distribution supply system for the El Barranco mutual
3 water domestic consumers association in Abiquiu in Rio Arriba
4 county;

5 Y. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to upgrade the
6 water system for the Gallina mutual domestic water consumers
7 association in Rio Arriba county;

8 Z. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
9 planning water and wastewater treatment facilities in Chama in
10 Rio Arriba county;

11 AA. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
12 make improvements, including water line extensions, for the
13 upper La Plata water users association in San Juan county;

14 BB. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
15 construct a storage tank to hold untreated drinking water in
16 San Ysidro in Sandoval county;

17 CC. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)
18 to replace the water line on St. Andrews street in Rio Rancho
19 in Sandoval county;

20 DD. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
21 plan, design and construct the aerobic digester and dewatering
22 facility at the wastewater treatment plant in Bernalillo in
23 Sandoval county;

24 EE. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase 2
25 water system improvements to the Canyon mutual domestic water

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1 association in Sandoval county;

2 FF. nine thousand four hundred fifty dollars
3 (\$9,450) to replace an existing galvanized water storage
4 reservoir and delivery system for the Solacito mutual domestic
5 water consumers association water system in Santa Fe county;

6 GG. seven thousand two hundred fifty dollars
7 (\$7,250) to repair the septic system and make other related
8 improvements to the Solacito mutual domestic water consumers
9 association water system in Santa Fe county;

10 HH. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to design a
11 wastewater treatment facility, a filtration plant and a
12 wastewater collection system in Elephant Butte to serve
13 Elephant Butte, Truth or Consequences and Williamsburg in
14 Sierra county;

15 II. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
16 expand the sewer system for the El Prado water and sanitation
17 district in Taos county;

18 JJ. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
19 phase 1 wastewater improvements in the El Valle de los Ranchos
20 water and sanitation district in Taos county;

21 KK. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to make
22 improvements, including purchasing and installing water
23 meters, for the Talpa mutual domestic water consumers
24 association in Taos county;

25 LL. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase

1 and install water meters, assemblies and make other related
2 improvements to the Tajique water system in Torrance county;

3 MM twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to design
4 and construct a wastewater system in Willard in Torrance
5 county; and

6 NN. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
7 rehabilitate the sanitary sewer system and install an inceptor
8 line in Belen in Valencia county.

9 Section 13. STATE FAIR PROJECT--STATE FAIR COMMISSION--
10 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
11 of this act, upon certification by the state fair commission
12 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, one
13 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated to the
14 state fair commission to make improvements and furnish and
15 equip the African-American pavilion at the state fairgrounds
16 in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county.

17 Section 14. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROJECTS--SEVERANCE TAX
18 BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
19 upon certification by the department of health that the need
20 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts
21 are appropriated to the department of health for the following
22 purposes:

23 A. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
24 plan, design and construct or purchase a modular building for
25 a facility for the Hatch health and human services center in

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1 Dona Ana county; and

2 B. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to purchase
3 equipment, including computers and a copy machine, for Taos
4 community services in Taos county.

5 Section 15. HIGHWAY PROJECTS--STATE HIGHWAY AND
6 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to
7 the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
8 the state highway and transportation department that the need
9 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts
10 are appropriated to the state highway and transportation
11 department for the following purposes:

12 A. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for
13 road improvements in the north area of Albuquerque in house
14 district 23 in Bernalillo county;

15 B. one hundred thirty-five thousand dollars
16 (\$135,000) to acquire rights of way and to construct roadway
17 drainage and pavement improvements to Five Points road from
18 Bridge boulevard to Atrisco drive in the south valley,
19 including sections of this street both inside and outside the
20 city of Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

21 C. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to construct
22 improvements to Sun Beam road in the Five Points area of the
23 south valley in Bernalillo county;

24 D. twenty-three thousand dollars (\$23,000) for

11 division of the department of finance and administration
12 pursuant to Subsection 0000000000 of Section 15 of Chapter 23
13 of Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.) to plan, design and construct a public
14 swimming pool in Clayton in Union county, contingent upon the
15 passage of an eight hundred thousand dollar (\$800,000) bond
16 issue in Union county, shall not be expended for the original
17 purpose but are reauthorized and appropriated to plan, design
18 and construct a recreational facility in Clayton in Union
19 county.

5 the department of health pursuant to Subsection C of Section
6 13 of Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st S.S.) for capital
7 improvements at the San Miguel clinic in Dona Ana county shall
8 not be expended for the original purpose but are reauthorized
9 and appropriated to acquire land for, plan, design, construct,

13 year 2006.

15 Section 111. NAVAJO SEWAGE LAGOON STUDY--CHANGE TO RAMAH
16 NAVAJO CHAPTER--EXTEND EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The proceeds from
17 the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico
18 office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection Y of Section
19 18 of Chapter 118 of Laws 1998 for a feasibility study to
20 plan, design and implement improvements to a sewage lagoon in
21 Navajo in McKinley county shall not be expended for that
22 purpose in Navajo but are reauthorized and appropriated for
23 the same purpose at the Ramah Navajo chapter in McKinley
24 county. The period of time in which this appropriation may be

16 2000 (2nd S.S.) to purchase land to relocate the fire
17 department building to a larger lot in Los Chavez in Valencia
18 county shall not be expended for the original purpose but are
19 reauthorized and appropriated to the state highway and
20 transportation department for road improvements to Camino de
21 Los Chavez in Valencia county.

22 B. The proceeds from the sale of severance tax
23 bonds appropriated to the local government division of the

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1 office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection UU of Section
2 13 of Chapter 23 of Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.) to construct and
3 equip a fiber optic station for Rock Springs in McKinley
4 county shall not be expended for the original purpose but are
5 reauthorized and appropriated to design and install telephone
6 lines and other communication infrastructure at Rock Springs

8 Section 118. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
9 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
10 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
11 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
12 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be
13 made for purposes other than those specified in the
14 appropriation.

15 Section 119. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
16 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
17 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
18 public places fund.

19 Section 120. REPEAL.--Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.), Chapter 23,
20 Section 84 is repealed.

21 Section 121. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
22 peace, health and safety that this act take effect
23 immediately.
