AN ACT

**RELATING TO THE AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION
BONDS FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AMENDING THE 2002 CAPITAL
PROJECTS GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ACT; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION;
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

**Section 1. Laws 2002, Chapter 93, Section 10 is amended
to read:**

"Section 10. PROJECTS. --

**A. The proceeds from the sale of bonds issued
