

HOUSE TAXATION AND REVENUE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL 88

45TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2002

AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING BALANCES; CHANGING THE PURPOSE OF SEVERANCE TAX BOND APPROPRIATIONS; CHANGING GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS; CLARIFYING CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF SEVERANCE TAX BOND PROCEEDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE REVERSION OF UNEXPENDED BALANCES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the

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1 amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The
2 state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of
3 the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
4 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been
5 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the
6 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
7 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
8 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
9 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
10 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

11 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
12 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
13 the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed
14 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
15 act. If an agency has not certified the need for the issuance
16 of the bonds for a particular project, including projects that
17 have been reauthorized, by the end of fiscal year 2004, the
18 authorization for that project is void.

19 C. Before an agency may certify for the issuance
20 of severance tax bonds, the project must be developed
21 sufficiently so that the agency reasonably expects to:

22 (1) incur within six months after the
23 applicable bonds have been issued a substantial binding
24 obligation to a third party to expend at least five percent of
25 the bond proceeds for the project; and

1 (2) spend at least eighty-five percent of the
2 bond proceeds within three years after the applicable bonds
3 have been issued.

4 D. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
5 another section of this act, the unexpended balance from the
6 proceeds of severance tax bonds issued for a project,
7 including projects that have been reauthorized, shall revert
8 to the severance tax bonding fund as follows:

9 (1) for projects for which severance tax
10 bonds were issued to match federal grants, six months after
11 completion of the project;

12 (2) for projects for which severance tax
13 bonds were issued to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment,
14 educational technology or other equipment or furniture that is
15 not related to a more inclusive construction or renovation
16 project, at the end of the fiscal year following the fiscal
17 year in which the severance tax bonds were issued for the
18 purchase after reserving for unpaid costs and expenses covered
19 by binding written obligations to third parties; and

20 (3) for all other projects for which
21 severance tax bonds were issued, within six months of
22 completion of the project, but no later than the end of fiscal
23 year 2007.

24 E. Except for appropriations to the capital
25 program fund, money from severance tax bond proceeds provided

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1 pursuant to this act shall not be used to pay indirect project
2 costs.

3 F. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
4 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
5 and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
6 accounting principles have been paid.

7 Section 2. GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUND APPROPRIATIONS--
8 LIMITATIONS-- REVERSIONS. --

9 A. Except as otherwise provided in this section or
10 another section of this act, the unexpended balance of an
11 appropriation made in this act from the general fund or other
12 state fund, including changes to prior appropriations, shall
13 revert to the originating fund as follows:

14 (1) for projects for which appropriations
15 were made to match federal grants, six months after completion
16 of the project;

17 (2) for projects for which appropriations
18 were made to purchase vehicles, heavy equipment, educational
19 technology or equipment or furniture that is not related to a
20 more inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end
21 of the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the
22 appropriation was made for the purchase after reserving for
23 unpaid costs and expenses covered by binding written
24 obligations to third parties; and

25 (3) for all other projects for which

1 appropriations were made, within six months of completion of
2 the project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2007.

3 B. Except for appropriations to the capital
4 program fund, money from appropriations made in this act shall
5 not be used to pay indirect project costs.

6 C. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
7 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after costs
8 and expenses recognized in accordance with generally accepted
9 accounting principles have been paid.

10 Section 3. AGING PROJECTS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
11 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
12 of this act, upon certification by the state agency on aging
13 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
14 following amounts are appropriated to the state agency on
15 aging for the following purposes:

16 1. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) for equipment
17 and additional construction at La Amistad senior center in
18 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

19 2. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
20 repair the roof at Los Volcanes senior center in Albuquerque
21 in Bernalillo county;

22 3. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to purchase
23 tables, chairs and a sound system for Los Volcanes senior
24 center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

25 4. twenty-four thousand eight hundred ten dollars

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1 (\$24,810) to furnish the North Valley senior facility in
2 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

3 5. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
4 automated external defibrillators for senior centers in
5 Bernalillo county;

6 6. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to make
7 capital improvements, including fencing and parking lot
8 paving, to the Lake Arthur senior center in Chaves county;

9 7. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to make
10 capital improvements, including compliance with the
11 requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990,
12 to the JOY center for senior services in Chaves county;

13 8. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for a park
14 recreation area for the senior center in Loving in Eddy
15 county;

16 9. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to construct
17 a senior center in Artesia in Eddy county;

18 10. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to make
19 improvements, including enclosing the patio area, at the
20 senior center in Santa Clara in Grant county;

21 11. forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to
22 purchase a sixteen-passenger bus for the senior center at
23 Casamero chapter in McKinley county;

24 12. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to purchase
25 a van for the senior citizens' program at the Mariano Lake

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1 chapter in McKinley county;

2 13. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to purchase
3 a passenger van for the Baca senior center in the Baca-Prewitt
4 chapter of the Navajo Nation in McKinley county;

5 14. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to purchase a
6 modular office building or to construct a building for the
7 eight northern Indian pueblos council senior programs at the
8 Pojoaque, Picuris, San Ildefonso, Nambe and Tesuque senior
9 nutrition centers in Santa Fe and Taos counties;

10 15. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to expand and
11 equip the kitchen facility of the Espanola senior center in
12 Espanola in Rio Arriba county;

13 16. ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) to purchase
14 handicapped-accessible vans for the senior programs at the
15 pueblos of Santa Ana and Sandia in Sandoval county;

16 17. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to construct
17 the southside senior center in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

18 18. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
19 (\$125,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a senior
20 center for the Glorieta-Eldorado area of Santa Fe county; and

21 19. forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to
22 design a senior center in the southside of Santa Fe in Santa
23 Fe county.

24 Section 4. ARMORY PROJECTS--STATE ARMORY BOARD--
25 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1

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1 of this act, upon certification by the state armory board that
2 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
3 amounts are appropriated to the state armory board for the
4 following purposes:

5 1. ninety-eight thousand eight hundred ten dollars
6 (\$98,810) to make capital improvements, including re-roofing
7 and replacing the heating, ventilation and air conditioning
8 infrastructure, to a building being used as a center for
9 contemporary arts in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

10 2. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for site
11 improvements, including drainage and erosion control, access
12 modifications and upgrades to existing roads, at the Ocate
13 complex in Santa Fe county; and

14 3. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the
15 statewide armory renovation and rehabilitation project.

16 Section 5. COURT PROJECTS--NINTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT
17 COURT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
18 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the ninth
19 judicial district court that the need exists for the issuance
20 of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
21 ninth judicial district court for the following purposes:

22 1. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
23 courtroom audio equipment in the ninth judicial district court
24 in Clovis and Portales in Curry and Roosevelt counties;

25 2. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase

1 automobiles for use by the ninth judicial district court judge
2 in Curry and Roosevelt counties; and

3 3. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
4 security equipment for the ninth judicial district court in
5 Clovis and Portales in Curry and Roosevelt counties.

6 Section 6. RAILROAD PROJECT--CUMBRES AND TOLTEC SCENIC
7 RAILROAD COMMISSION--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the
8 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
9 Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission that the need
10 exists for the issuance of the bonds, four hundred forty-two
11 thousand dollars (\$442,000) is appropriated to the Cumbres and
12 Toltec scenic railroad commission for capital improvements,
13 including locomotive boiler work, heat and lighting for the
14 shop area and track upgrade, in Rio Arriba county, contingent
15 upon an equal match of appropriations and grants from the
16 state of Colorado.

17 Section 7. MUSEUM AND CULTURAL PROJECTS--OFFICE OF
18 CULTURAL AFFAIRS--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the
19 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
20 office of cultural affairs that the need exists for the
21 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
22 to the office of cultural affairs for the following purposes:

23 1. one hundred one thousand dollars (\$101,000) to
24 expand, improve and equip the library at the pueblo of Isleta
25 in Bernalillo county;

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1 2. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for phase 2
2 landscaping improvements, including paths, rest areas,
3 drinking fountains and fencing, at the New Mexico farm and
4 ranch heritage museum in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

5 3. seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) to plan a
6 children's discovery barn and a beef and horse barn at the New
7 Mexico farm and ranch heritage museum in Las Cruces in Dona
8 Ana county;

9 4. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
10 repairs and replacement of the windows at the New Mexico
11 museum of space history in Alamogordo in Otero county;

12 5. four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to design,
13 construct, furnish and equip the palace of the governors
14 project, including the annex site and the statewide services
15 building portion of the project, in Santa Fe in Santa Fe
16 county;

17 6. forty-eight thousand seven hundred fifty
18 dollars (\$48,750) to design and construct exhibits at the
19 Camino Real international heritage center in Socorro county;
20 and

21 7. forty thousand eight hundred ten dollars
22 (\$40,810) for the statewide conservation of public art that
23 was created during the Depression era.

24 Section 8. E-COMMERCE PROJECTS STATEWIDE--ECONOMIC
25 DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the

1 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
2 economic development department that the need exists for the
3 issuance of the bonds, twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is
4 appropriated to the economic development department to
5 purchase and install technology infrastructure for e-commerce
6 initiatives statewide.

7 Section 9. EAGLE NEST LAKE PROJECT--ENERGY, MINERALS AND
8 NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS. --Pursuant
9 to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification
10 by the energy, minerals and natural resources department that
11 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, five million
12 dollars (\$5,000,000) is appropriated to the energy, minerals
13 and natural resources department to purchase Eagle Nest lake
14 and environs in Colfax county.

15 Section 10. WATER PROJECTS--OFFICE OF THE STATE
16 ENGINEER--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS. --Pursuant to the provisions of
17 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of the
18 state engineer that the need exists for the issuance of the
19 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the office of
20 the state engineer for the following purposes:

- 21 1. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to drill
- 22 wells for the Hope community ditch association in Eddy county;
- 23 2. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to develop a
- 24 water supply for the Gallup-Navajo water supply project in
- 25 McKinley county;

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1 3. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan,
2 design and construct drainage systems at Elephant Butte in
3 Sierra county;

4 4. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to repair the
5 spillway and armor the headwall of the dam for the Ponderosa
6 ditch association in Sandoval county; and

7 5. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) for
8 improvements and inlet and pipeline extensions to the Cuchillo
9 Valley water users acequia association water system in Sierra
10 county.

11 Section 11. ENVIRONMENT PROJECTS--DEPARTMENT OF
12 ENVIRONMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions
13 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department
14 of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the
15 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
16 department of environment for the following purposes:

17 1. forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to
18 complete phase 3 of the water system improvements project in
19 Tijeras in Bernalillo county;

20 2. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to make
21 capital improvements, including repairing and replacing of
22 water lines, for the Cumberland cooperative water users
23 association in Chaves county;

24 3. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to extend a
25 water line to the training center for police and firefighters

1 in Roswell in Chaves county;

2 4. fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) to
3 renovate or construct a water tank in Grants in Cibola county;

4 5. forty-eight thousand eight hundred ten dollars
5 (\$48,810) to renovate or construct a water tank in Grants in
6 Cibola county;

7 6. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to repair
8 and update the water system in Grady in Curry county;

9 7. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
10 repair the water tower in Melrose in Curry county;

11 8. ninety-two thousand dollars (\$92,000) to plan,
12 design and construct an administrative office for the Berino
13 mutual domestic water consumers association in Dona Ana
14 county;

15 9. sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$68,000) for an
16 engineering report and environmental assessment to improve the
17 water system of the Berino mutual domestic water consumers
18 association in Dona Ana county;

19 10. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to acquire
20 rights of way, engineer, survey and construct improvements to
21 the Dona Ana mutual domestic water consumers association water
22 system in Dona Ana county;

23 11. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to extend
24 the distribution lines to loop the water system at the south
25 end of Estrada road in Mesilla in Dona Ana county;

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1 12. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for
2 improvements to the Malaga mutual domestic water consumers and
3 sewage works association water and sewer system in Eddy
4 county;

5 13. forty thousand eight hundred ten dollars
6 (\$40,810) to expand and construct the wastewater treatment
7 plant in Artesia in Eddy county;

8 14. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for phase 3
9 construction of the effluent reuse project in Carlsbad in Eddy
10 county;

11 15. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to make water
12 system improvements in Tatum in Lea county;

13 16. thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$38,000) to
14 replace a sewer machine in Eunice in Lea county;

15 17. two hundred nine thousand seven hundred fifty
16 dollars (\$209,750) to construct a water tank in Corona in
17 Lincoln county;

18 18. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to renovate
19 the Bayo wastewater treatment plant in Los Alamos in Los
20 Alamos county;

21 19. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to equip the
22 northwest New Mexico regional solid waste authority in
23 McKinley county;

24 20. one hundred eighty-three thousand eight
25 hundred ten dollars (\$183,810) to plan, design, engineer and

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1 construct improvements, including a hydraulic expansion, to
2 the wastewater treatment plant in Gallup in McKinley county;

3 21. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) to construct
4 an additional storage tank and booster station and make
5 related improvements in the Gameraco water and sanitation
6 district in McKinley county;

7 22. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to equip the
8 northwest New Mexico regional solid waste authority in
9 McKinley county;

10 23. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
11 replace water and sewer lines in Tucumcari in Quay county;

12 24. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
13 repair and renovate the sewage plant in Tucumcari in Quay
14 county;

15 25. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
16 improve the water distribution supply system for the El
17 Barranco mutual water domestic consumers association in
18 Abiquiu in Rio Arriba county;

19 26. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
20 upgrade the water system for the Gallina mutual domestic water
21 consumers association in Rio Arriba county;

22 27. eleven thousand one hundred ninety dollars
23 (\$11,190) to make improvements to the water system of the
24 Duranes y Gavilan mutual domestic water consumers association
25 in Rio Arriba county;

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1 28. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
2 construct a water well for the Ojo Sarco mutual domestic water
3 consumers association in Rio Arriba county;

4 29. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)
5 to engineer, plan, design and construct improvements,
6 including water line extensions, for the upper La Plata water
7 users association in San Juan county;

8 30. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to improve the
9 sewer line on Union street in Las Vegas in San Miguel county;

10 31. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to repair the
11 water lines and make other related improvements to the water
12 system in the Ribera mutual domestic water consumers
13 association in San Miguel county;

14 32. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
15 expand the landfill, including acquiring land, at the south
16 Sandoval county regional landfill in Sandoval county;

17 33. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to expand the
18 landfill, including acquiring land, at the south Sandoval
19 county regional landfill in Sandoval county;

20 34. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for phase 2
21 water system improvements for the Canyon mutual domestic water
22 association in Sandoval county;

23 35. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to conduct
24 an engineering analysis and construct a wastewater system in
25 Cochiti Lake in Sandoval county;

1 36. seventy-eight thousand seven hundred fifty
2 dollars (\$78,750) to expand the landfill, including acquiring
3 land, at the south Sandoval county regional landfill in
4 Sandoval county;

5 37. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for water
6 distribution system improvements for the Solacito mutual
7 domestic water consumers association in Santa Fe county;

8 38. four hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
9 (\$425,000) to purchase sanitation equipment, including a
10 scraper and rear loader, for Truth or Consequences in Sierra
11 county;

12 39. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
13 construct a wastewater treatment plant and collection lines in
14 Elephant Butte and Elephant Butte state park in Sierra county;

15 40. sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) for
16 phase 1 wastewater improvements in the El Valle de los Ranchos
17 water and sanitation district in Taos county;

18 41. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to make
19 improvements to the water system of El Prado water and
20 sanitation district in El Prado in Taos county;

21 42. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to make
22 improvements to the water system of the Talpa mutual domestic
23 water consumers association in Taos county;

24 43. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for
25 improvements to the water system in Questa in Taos county;

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1 44. three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
2 (\$375,000) for phase 1 wastewater improvements in the El Valle
3 de los Ranchos water and sanitation district in Taos county;

4 45. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
5 purchase and install a new tank and extend the water lines and
6 insulation for the Trampas mutual domestic water consumers
7 association in Taos county;

8 46. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the
9 Santa Barbara valley mutual domestic water consumers
10 association to plan, design and construct a community domestic
11 water system for Llano Largo and Llano de la Llegua in the
12 upper Rodarte communities in Taos county;

13 47. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
14 acquire property for a new well and tank, extend distribution
15 lines and make other related improvements for the Chamisal
16 mutual domestic water consumers association in Taos county;
17 and

18 48. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
19 replace the domestic water system, sanitary sewer system,
20 sewer lift station and part of the roadway at east Chavez
21 street in Belen in Valencia county.

22 Section 12. STATE FAIR PROJECT--STATE FAIR COMMISSION--
23 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
24 of this act, upon certification by the state fair commission
25 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, eighty-

1 five thousand eight hundred ten dollars (\$85,810) is
2 appropriated to the state fair commission to make improvements
3 and furnish and equip the African-American pavilion at the New
4 Mexico state fairgrounds in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county.

5 Section 13. DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY PROJECT--GENERAL SERVICES
6 DEPARTMENT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions
7 of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the general
8 services department that the need exists for the issuance of
9 the bonds, three million three hundred thirty-three thousand
10 three hundred thirty-three dollars (\$3,333,333) is
11 appropriated to the general services department to continue
12 converting the state's microwave radio system to digital
13 technology.

14 Section 14. HEALTH FACILITY PROJECTS--DEPARTMENT OF
15 HEALTH--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
16 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department of
17 health that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the
18 following amounts are appropriated to the department of health
19 for the following purposes:

20 1. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
21 plan, design and construct or purchase a modular building for
22 a facility for the Hatch health and human services center in
23 Dona Ana county;

24 2. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
25 plan, design, construct, equip and furnish the outpatient

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1 chemotherapy facility in the Nor-Lea hospital district in Lea
2 county;

3 3. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
4 design, construct, equip and furnish the medical facility in
5 Estancia in Torrance county; and

6 4. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to design,
7 construct, equip and furnish the medical facility in Estancia
8 in Torrance county.

9 Section 15. HIGHWAY PROJECTS-- STATE HIGHWAY AND
10 TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT-- SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.-- Pursuant to
11 the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by
12 the state highway and transportation department that the need
13 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts
14 are appropriated to the state highway and transportation
15 department for the following purposes:

16 1. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to purchase
17 the rights of way to extend Paseo del Norte from Golf Course
18 road to Ventana ranch and to extend Unser boulevard from

6 MODULAR BUILDING. --The balance of the unencumbered proceeds
7 from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the New
8 Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection CC of
9 Section 15 of Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st S.S.) for developing
10 and constructing building sites and infrastructure, plumbing
11 and sewer system installation and the purchase of manufactured
12 housing to be used as an administrative office complex for the
13 Torreon Star Lake chapter in Sandoval and McKinley counties
14 shall not be expended for the original purpose, but is
15 reauthorized and appropriated to purchase and transport a
16 modular building for the Torreon Star Lake chapter in Sandoval
17 and McKinley counties. The period of time in which the
18 appropriation may be expended is extended through fiscal year
19 2007. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the
20 end of fiscal year 2007 shall revert to the severance tax
21 bonding fund.

22 Section 57. BLANCO CANYON BATHROOM ADDITIONS-- CHANGE
23 PURPOSE FOR BATHROOM ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CARSON
24 SOUTH AREA OF HUERFANO IN SAN JUAN COUNTY. --The balance of the
25 proceeds from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to

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1 the New Mexico office of Indian affairs pursuant to Subsection
2 00 of Section 13 of Chapter 23 of Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.) for
3 bathroom additions at Blanco canyon in the Huerfano chapter in
4 San Juan county shall not be expended for its original purpose
5 but is reauthorized and appropriated to construct bathroom
6 additions, install plumbing and improve substandard bathrooms
7 in the homes of indigent families in the Carson south area of
8 Huerfano in San Juan county.

9 Section 58. OTIS SOUTH AREA OF HUERFANO BATHROOM
10 ADDITIONS--CHANGE PURPOSE OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION FOR
11 BATHROOM ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CARSON SOUTH AREA
12 OF HUERFANO IN SAN JUAN COUNTY.--The balance of the general
13 fund appropriation made to the New Mexico office of Indian
14 affairs pursuant to Subsection R of Section 42 of Chapter 23
15 of Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.) to construct bathroom additions and
16 install plumbing in homes of indigent families in the Otis
17 south area of Huerfano in San Juan county shall not be
18 expended for its original purpose but is appropriated to
19 construct bathroom additions, install plumbing and improve
20 substandard bathrooms in the homes of indigent families in the
21 Carson south area of Huerfano in San Juan county.

22 Section 59. PUEBLO OF SAN ILDEFONSO CAPITAL PROJECTS--
23 CHANGE PURPOSE TO RENOVATE COMMUNITY CENTER-- EXTEND
24 EXPENDITURE PERIOD.--The proceeds from the sale of severance
25 tax bonds appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian

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1 affairs pursuant to Subsection N of Section 18 of Chapter 118
2 of Laws 1998 and reauthorized in Subsections A, B and C of
3 Section 90 of Chapter 2 of Laws 1999 (1st S.S.) for various
4 capital projects at the pueblo of San Ildefonso in Santa Fe
5 county shall not be expended for the original purposes but are
6 reauthorized and appropriated to renovate a community center
7 at the pueblo of San Ildefonso in Santa Fe county. The period
8 of time in which this appropriation may be expended is
9 extended through fiscal year 2007. Any unexpended or
10 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2007
11 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

12 Section 60. ALAMO COURT BUILDING IN SOCORRO COUNTY--
13 EXPAND PURPOSE. --The proceeds from the sale of severance tax
14 bonds appropriated to the corrections department pursuant to
15 Laws 1995, Chapter 214, Section 3, reauthorized in Paragraph
16 (15) of Subsection A of Section 23 of Chapter 14 of Laws 1996
17 to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for designing,
18 constructing and equipping a court building for the Navajo
19 Nation in Alamo in Socorro county and further reauthorized to
20 extend the expenditure period pursuant to Laws 2000 (2nd
21 S.S.), Chapter 23, Section 89, may also be expended to plan,
22 purchase, install, furnish and landscape a building for court
23 purposes in Alamo in Socorro county.

24 Section 61. CLAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT ALTERNATIVE
25 SCHOOL IN UNION COUNTY-- CHANGE PURPOSE TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT

1 FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT.--On the effective date of this act, the
 2 balance of the unencumbered proceeds from the sale of
 3 severance tax bonds appropriated to the state department of
 4 public education pursuant to Subsection TTTT of Section 16 of
 5 Chapter 23 of Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.) to construct or renovate a
 6 facility to be used as an alternative school for the Clayton
 7 public school district in Union county shall not be expended
 8 for the original purpose, but is reauthorized and appropriated
 9 to purchase equipment for the Clayton public school district
 10 in Union county.

11 Section 62. CLAYTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT ALTERNATIVE
 12 SCHOOL IN UNION COUNTY--CHANGE PURPOSE OF GENERAL FUND
 13 APPROPRIATION TO PURCHASE EQUIPMENT FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT.--The
 14 balance of the general fund appropriation made pursuant to
 15 Subsection TT of Section 45 of Chapter 23 of Laws 2000 (2nd
 16 S.S.) to construct or renovate a facility to be used as an
 17 alternative school for the Clayton public school district in
 18 Union county shall not be expended for the original purpose
 19 but is appropriated to purchase equipment for the Clayton
 20 public school district in Union county.

21 Section 63. REPEAL.--Laws 2000 (2nd S.S.), Chapter 23,
 22 Section 84 is repealed.

23 Section 64. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
 24 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
 25 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the

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1 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
2 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be
3 made for purposes other than those specified in the
4 appropriation.

5 Section 65. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
6 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
7 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
8 public places fund.

9 Section 66. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
10 peace, health and safety that this act take effect
11 immediately.
